So, Now You Know. I remember a student from years gone by, scaling down the anxiety and embarrassment of a friend by showing the friend what to do about some matter about which I'm not all that sure: but whatever it was, the student anticipated the reaction of the friend, and gave the needed explanation before the friend had a chance to be anxious. The act of consideration was concluded by the words: "So, now you know." Translated, these words actually meant, "See? Nothing to feel anxious about."

This past weekend - except for the Dallas City and Warsaw Masses, which we'll address this weekend - we presented to our people a type of "So, now you know" step ahead of anxiety.

We presented what we're going to do this coming year, July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024. A tuition assistance fund managed locally by the pastor, out of recognition that family need is now linked to the school's need for students. The main financial goal for the coming year, each church having its own unique challenge. The return to the Called and Gifted Charismatic Gifts Inventory to search out how our lives can be enriched by discovering the gifts of the Holy Spirit. A year of sermons to address the moral and Church issues of the day, so that our people actually know what the Catholic Church teaches, and why. Acting upon our Pastoral Council's recommendation to prioritize youth ministry and outreach to young adults. Continuing development of ministry to our Spanish speaking brothers and sisters in Christ.

And a simple concluding statement: this time next year, we'll be explaining how we did this. Not "if", not "whether". We will be explaining *how* we did this. So, now you know!
