Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ

JUNE 11, 2023

Deuteronomy 8:2-3,14b-16a;
1 Corinthians 10:16-17; John 6:51-58

Today's feast is usually known by its Latin title "Corpus Christi." We firmly believe that, at the consecration of Mass, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of the risen Lord Jesus Christ. In Communion, then, we do not receive bread and wine; we receive the glorified Christ under the appearances of bread and wine.

After the consecration, nothing of the bread or wine remains except the "accidental appearances" such as taste, size, texture, etc. The reality is the risen Lord!

But we can *receive* the Body and Blood of Christ every day without any benefit unless we *give* ourselves to Christ. We must live by his *word* if his *sacrament* is to be of any benefit to us. This is the message of today's Mass.

The first reading tells of Moses' last instructions to the Israelites. He reminds them that they were all fed by manna, a miraculous food. But the manna did not save them unless they lived by the word of the Lord. Through the centuries, rabbis began to speak of the "bread of life" as the "Torah" or God's holy word. Whoever "ate the bread" of the Torah would live forever.

In the Gospel, Jesus says that he, not the Torah, is the bread of life. He replaces the Torah; we must live by his word. Then, astoundingly, he states that the new manna that he will give will be his flesh!

The Eucharist, then, is the sign that we give ourselves totally and completely to keep the word of Christ. Whoever lives according to his word will richly profit from the Eucharist.

The second reading reminds us of the social implications of the Eucharist. If you and you and you and I are united with the same Eucharistic Lord, then we must be united with each other. We, though many, become one Body of Christ. Therefore we must carry each other's burdens and share each other's sorrows.

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ Solemnity, June 11, 2023

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. If there were a solemnity that describes who we are as a Church, it would be this celebration because the Eucharist is the front and center of all that we are and all that we do. It is in the celebration of the Eucharist that we are given a gift beyond words, the gift of Jesus, giving us His very self, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. In receiving Him, He invites us to become treasured vessels of His presence; living and breathing tabernacles of His glory. We become what we eat and drink, namely we become the Body of Christ. There is no greater role or mission than to be the tabernacle of His presence to a broken and sinful world. For it is being that tabernacle that we offer hope and vision for all to see in the love and care we have for others.

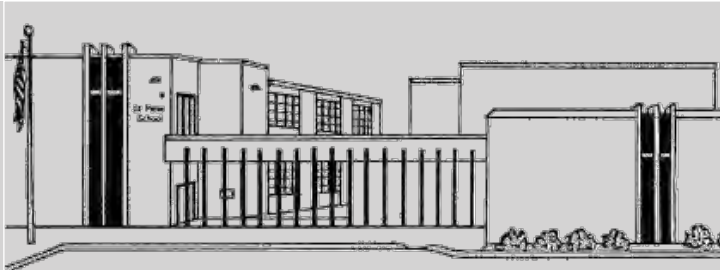
After a long absence from receiving Holy Communion under the appearance of Jesus' blood in the cup because of Covid, we are returning this weekend to our traditional practice of Holy Communion under both species. For those who are still reluctant to drink from the Cup, it is fine to receive as you are doing now. But, I expect respect for others who choose to drink from the one cup. As a reminder I quote from the Catechism of the Catholic Church (1390): "Since Christ is present under each of the species, communion under the species of bread alone make it possible to receive all the fruit of Eucharistic grace. For pastoral reasons this manner of receiving communion has been legitimately established as the most common form in the Latin rite. But the sign of communion is more complete when given under both kinds, since in that form the sign of the Eucharistic meal appears more clearly." And so this weekend we return to our traditional practice of Holy Communion under the species of bread and wine.

This Sunday through Friday, June 16, we will be sponsoring the Totus Tuus Summer Camp. This camp will be held on the campus of St. Francis Solanus Church and we will be co-hosting this camp with them. It is for students going into 1st-12th grades. The word "Totus Tuus" is Latin and means "totally yours" and was the motto by Pope St. John Paul II. Please consult the bulletin for more details.

There are many other spiritual and social opportunities taking place for our parishioners to consider. There is a Men's Cursillo in several weeks, there is a TEC this weekend, St. Francis is having their parish picnic and there is a Sunday Funday at 57 & Vine on Sunday, June 25. Please consult the bulletin if you want to spiritually reward yourself with an experience, or just enjoy the company of others with the various social events.

We have been doing our best to get our records updated concerning the many shut-ins that we have within our parish. We sometimes come across people we have missed, all unintentional. That is why I am writing to you. If you know of someone who has been missed, or address has been changed, or whatever else might be the case of a missing parishioner, please call the rectory and let us know. As we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, I want to remind you that our diocese will be having a Eucharistic renewal on Saturday, October 28, in Springfield. That weekend we are not allowed to have any Masses (funerals, weddings, and Saturday evening Masses for the weekend), encouraging people to attend this solemn celebration with all the priests, deacons, and Bishop of the diocese. More details will be forthcoming but I'm setting the stage so as not to surprise anyone. Churches are limited to a number of tickets, based on their October attendance count. We have over 200 tickets reserved so I ask you to begin to think about reserving that date and representing St. Peter Church at this Eucharistic renewal. There are several well known speakers including Scott Hahn. We are at the beginning stages on how to allocate our tickets to interested parishioners.

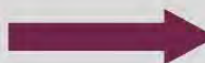
