

#### We Request Your Thoughts and Suggestions.

Last weekend, we announced the closing of the Father's Friend's Outreach. We explained that our assistance to those in need has to be reined in a bit because of the new situation in which we find ourselves, with only one priest here. We also explained that we are budgeting an amount of money so that we will continue to help those who are in need as much as we are able to do so. And those of you who have given so consistently and generously to Father's Friends are invited to let us know what you want us to do with your most recent donations.

In place of Father's Friends, we are beginning a fund for tuition assistance for families of students at Sts. Peter and Paul School. And we need to know your thoughts and even your position on such a fund. For example: Should the collection at the beginning of the month for the school become specifically designated for tuition assistance? Do you object to the establishment of such a fund? Are there conditions under which you would (or would not) support the fund? I have stated that tuition assistance determination models come across as demeaning, intrusive, and discouraging to families coming forward to request assistance. Do you agree? Are there any suggestions you have to correct this impression? Is there anything you could tell me that would give me cause to reconsider my position in any way?

There will be a type of survey form forthcoming. But please start thinking about this now. You will be most helpful, whether in agreement or disagreement, acceptance, or reservation, in responding to my request for your thoughts.
