

#### About the Proposed New Visitor's Center in Nauvoo

For all the other churches in the county, please excuse the focus on SPPN; then again, if the unity of our churches has come to mean anything at all, perhaps everyone could read this as if SPPN belongs to everybody.

I have met with the competent authority of the LDS community of faith twice over the issue of the proposed Visitor Center. Each meeting was restricted in scope of presentation and invitation to react. (By the way: if you hear anything about me with regard to this, make sure you check things out with me. Nothing deliberate, I'm sure: but misunderstandings do occur. And I can straighten those out, when it comes to me.) I am aware of developments at meetings. I am all too aware of concerns from our Church and School, and the greater Nauvoo community.

For twenty years, I've seen this county as a national center for interreligious dialogue, on the basis of the importance being placed on Nauvoo and Carthage by the LDS community of faith. This vision has been the formal object of keeping all of our institutions operative. I have my motivation for engagement in the community; I realize I'm in a minority - probably of one! - on this one. But the fact is that we all have our motivations for engagement in which we all share - which is why I offer the following suggestion and encouragement.

If you haven't already: write our mayor. Make known your concerns: traffic, visibility, location, whatever. I myself have to handle concerns frequently. Because of my own experience with fielding the mail, may I say this? When you write, be direct, but polite. "Bottle the acid:" no threats, sarcasm, insults. The strength of your complaint is in the clarity of the issue you present: you want the issue to be the issue, and not the way you make your point.

Go ahead: write our mayor. Let your concerns be known. You never know how far your position might go. But you'll never find out, unless you act. Fr. T.
