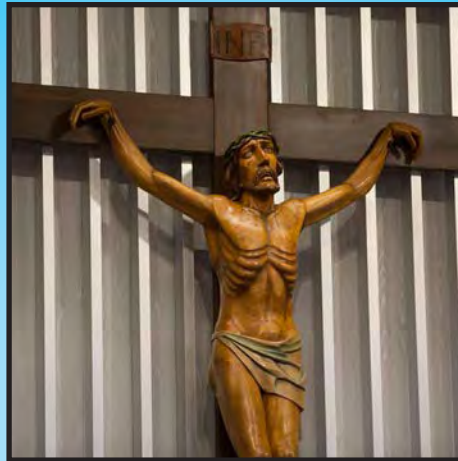

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



Welcome to the Franciscan Sisters of the Immaculate Heart of Mary (FIH) who are offering our **annual Missionary Appeal** for St. Anthony this weekend. The sisters are here to introduce their mission and describe their evangelization and relief efforts in India, Kenya, Uganda, and other apostolates around the world. The reason for the "Missionary Appeal" each year is to help us to recognize the good work that is being done in our name and in the name of the Church by these missionaries and others throughout the world. They are in need of our prayerful and material support. Please take the opportunity to show your commitment to the missions through their invitation to prayer and a special collection held this weekend..

A French missionary, the Rev. Father Louis Savinien Dupui, founded sisters' order in India in 1844. The basic aim of the order is to promote the education of the poor, especially poor girls irrespective of casts or creed. There are presently just over one thousand sisters serving in five countries, helping families suffering from lack of basic necessities for life. This year's appeal is for resources to repair and renovate the order's orphanage house. The FIH sisters earnestly request you to support prayerfully and financially their mission to provide a decent living quarters for the poor village girls. Your assistance in this regard will be appreciated and blessed. We assure you in return our humble prayers.

Thank you in advance for your support of this missionary work!



End of the fiscal year! I think we made it. There is a final payroll this week, and we have managed to pay our pension obligations and the other bills. It appears that we are still "in cash", by which I mean, we are not having to defer expenses and liabilities into next year because we are unable to pay them. At the same time we are doing this, we have also managed to segregate all of the funds received for 2023-24 school tuition into savings for next year rather than spending these resources to take care of "this year's" expenses. As you may remember a few years back, we had the bad habit of spending the next fiscal year's tuition revenue—tuition received in the spring for the next school year—before the 'next' fiscal year even started—this bad habit effectively concealed a collected-up operating debt that was being carried forward year-by-year on the order of about \$200,000.

About a month ago, I mentioned that we were about \$60k short for this fiscal year. This is reflected on the collection information each week on the next page-turn of this bulletin. How did we make up that difference then, allowing us to communicate the 'good news' that we 'made it'? The main source of funds came from 'squeezing down' other accounts in the parish organization... we received about \$18k from the school lunch room which was owed to the parish for salaries and wages. We received another \$18k from the men's society from last year's pancake breakfast, which was being held in their account 'until needed'. We received additional donations from the PTO (\$5k), the Men's Society (\$5k), and the Ladies' society (\$5k) which I would like to gratefully acknowledge. While I would have liked for them to have been able to keep their funds to carry out their other membership activities, leaders in each of these organizations have explained that they understand the primary importance of keeping us going as a parish without taking on any deficit spending or debt. The last \$10k came from additional reimbursements and savings, and so, as of the writing of this bulletin, provided we don't have any 'emergencies,' we seem to have made it out of the fiscal year without taking on any additional operating debt to be paid in future years. We run a very tight ship here and we are always just one catastrophe away from disappointing results, but once again we can celebrate that God provides through the generosity of his people. Be watching for our annual financial report sometime in the third quarter of 2023. Thank you for your support and generosity to St. Anthony Church and St. Dominic School.

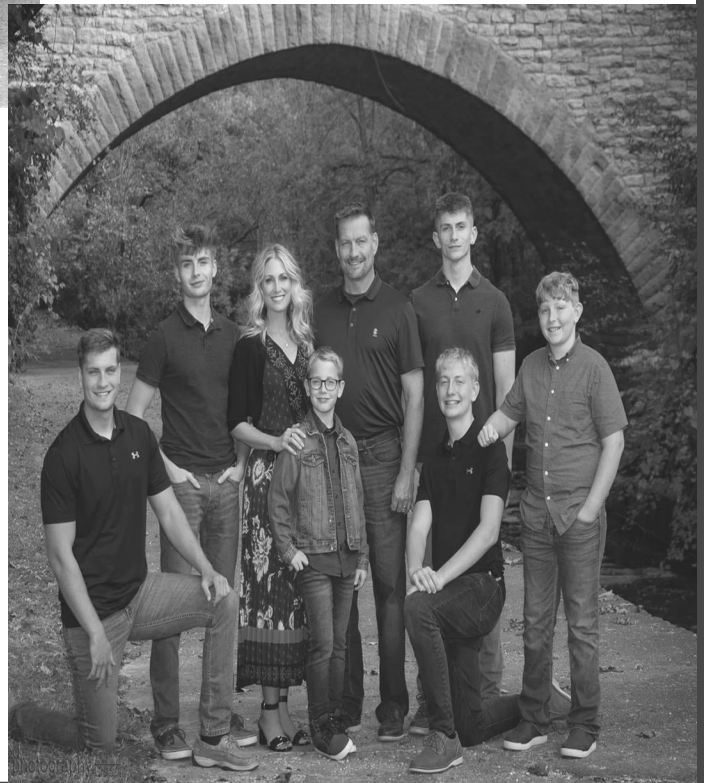


Welcome Mrs. Penny Weiman Preschool 3-year-old Teacher

Pilgrimage to Poland with Fr. Rafal

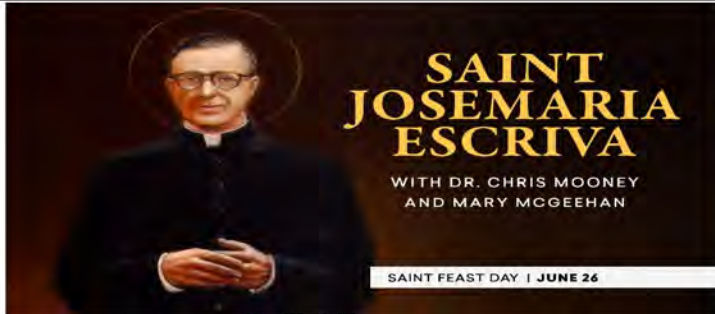
