

The Solemnity of the Holy Trinity and God's Portion Day.

The Church celebrates God revealing Himself to us today, on the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity. One God in substance; Three Divine Persons in distinction: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. No such thing as either a beginning or an end in the Three-in-One, the One-in-Three. From all eternity the Son proceeds from the Father, and the Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father and the Son. None of the Three Divine Persons "came first". The Father comprehends, expresses, loves Himself; this expression of Himself is the Son. The Son, as the Word of the Father, loves the Father; their communication of mutual love is the Holy Spirit. Without beginning or end. Always was, always will be. Pray the "Glory Be" prayer: says it all.

Just think about that a bit: God revealing to us who He really is. Not only that, but also, in revealing to us who He really is, He reveals to us who we really are. Now, take a look at Saints Peter and Paul School. God reveals Himself there, in the person of Jesus Christ and the action of the Holy Spirit. But in so doing, God unfolds our School and all that it's meant to be. When you support God's Portion Day, you're seeing God's "drawing back the curtain," in action! All kinds of people are coming together at every level of participation and involvement. That's the Holy Trinity at work in each and every one of us, trying to get us to see who He is, and who He sees us to be. Come and witness how interested the Holy Trinity is in us, the family, the community of Sts. Peter and Paul Catholic School! Get a good look at that "Glory Be" prayer, in action!
