Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

JUNE 4, 2023

Exodus 34:4b-6,8-9; 2 Corinthians 13:11-13; John 3:16-18

The first reading describes the awe experienced by Moses as he encountered the Lord on Mt. Sinai. The Lord is in the "cloud of glory." No one was permitted to go with Moses. Moses confesses the unworthiness of his people, but asks the Lord to go with them. But, we may ask, how can we approach the awesome Lord? Even when he tells us that he is the God of love, who are we that we can come before him?

The answer is in the Gospel: We can approach the Father through the Son, for "God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son." He did not send the Son to condemn, but that all might be saved through him. If we have seen the Son, we have seen the Father. We can approach the Father through the Son who became one of us – like us in all things except sin.

But the Son has returned to the Father's glory. Still, we are not alone. He has sent the Holy Spirit into our hearts. The Holy Spirit makes present the Son; he unites us in the one Body of Christ, the Son.

The word translated "fellowship" in the second reading really means "union with." United in the Holy Spirit, we are united with each other and made one in Christ, through whom we can approach the Father.

Our spiritual life must be rooted in the mystery of the Trinity. Our prayer and worship are offered to the Father through the Son in the Holy Spirit with Mary and all the saints. Give glory to the Father through the Son in the Holy Spirit!

THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

Dear St. Francis Solanus Parishioners:

You may be wondering this weekend, "Who is that man up there near Father?" Permit me to introduce myself to you. My name is Thomas Marten and I am a second-year seminarian studying for our Diocese while at Kenrick-Glennon Seminary in St. Louis. I am in the Pre-Theology program. This part of the seminary takes men who already have a degree in something unrelated to the seminary and provides them not only with philosophy courses but also with the healing and prayer life so many of us need.

As for my background, I grew up on my family's farm near Raymond, Illinois, just two hours away from Quincy. It was on that farm that I was raised in our faith and attended the now-closed St. Isidore Catholic Grade School in Farmersville, Illinois. I went on to public high school at Lincolnwood (Raymond) High School where I was heavily involved in the FFA (Future Farmers of America) and found myself earning a degree from Southern Illinois University-Carbondale in agricultural systems. I have two older sisters and one niece (who is one of my Goddaughters). My father passed away ten years ago from Lou Gehrig's Disease (ALS) and my mother remains on our farm where my uncle and cousin continue farming.

The man you see is obviously not fresh out of SIU. I spent the past decade working in various agricultural non-profit organizations including the Stark County Farm Bureau, the FarmHouse Foundation, and most recently the Angus Foundation.

God first called me in third grade to serve Him as a priest. Through a stubborn combination of my Irish and German ancestry, I held out for a couple of decades. Thankfully, I finally surrendered to His call and began listening to Him and not running away from this beautiful vocation. God continues to call men and women into His priesthood and as religious—too often we actively ignore the promptings He provides (at least I did).

Ultimately it was returning to regular confession and prayer, particularly a powerful encounter with our Eucharistic Lord in adoration, that caused me to quit a job I loved (and that had steak all the time) and pursue something even greater. As you see me throughout this summer, please stop me and say hello, but most of all, pray for me and in turn pray for the youth of St. Francis Solanus and across our diocese that they might listen to God's call for them, be it as priests, sisters or husbands and wives.


Knights of Columbus News


