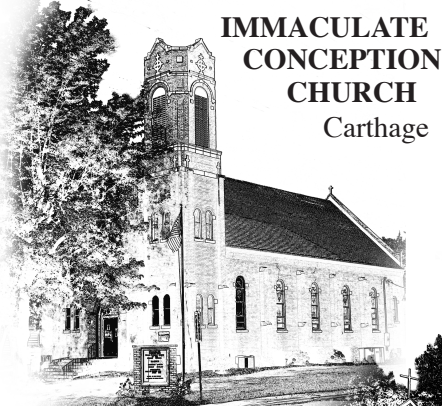
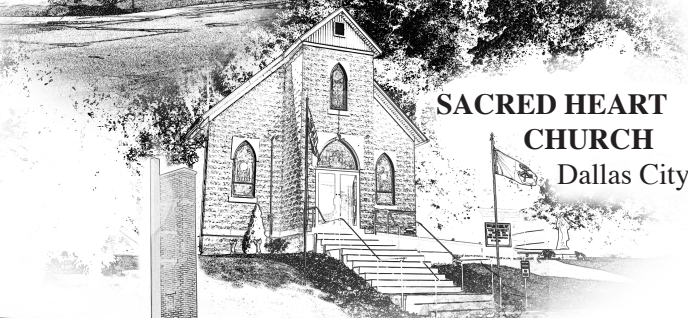

Reflections on the Fourth of July.

An interesting item about the apparition of Our Lady of Guadalupe to St. Juan Diego in December of 1531....One of the features of the tilma in and through which the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe is preserved, is a tiny cross at the neck of Holy Mary, Our Lady of Guadalupe. The Aztec population noticed that the cross was in the shape of the crosses found on the sails of the Spanish fleet coming to the lands of the Aztec nation. This told them something about the complexity of history: the European perspective of colonization and the Aztec perspective of invasion; the injustice of human (including child) Aztec sacrifice and that of the Spanish explorers and military; the difficulty of the growing mix of the native Indian and Spanish population, with the class system in each race; and the introduction of Catholic Christianity to the Aztec view of both the world and the afterlife. And in seeing that tiny cross on the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe, the native population saw through the complexity of history: the hand of God at work. The nation of Mexico came from this. And with Saint Junipero Serra, the meaning of Our Lady of Guadalupe reached into the foundation of the state of California.

Look at that. History. All of it. None of it having to be dismembered. With a recognition of the enduring good that worked through and conquered the evils brought to bear on the situation. Hey there, United States History: how about learning a lesson from this?

One of the many things we found out this past year is that civic holidays are so attached to vacation and travel that participation in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is very small. So, we're going to pass on Mass July 4. But we will have Masses for the welfare of our nation and blessing of cemeteries throughout the next week and a half. Here's how these Masses are scheduled:

Monday, July 3, at SPPN, 8 a.m., with cemetery blessing to follow.

Monday, July 3, at SHW, 5:30 p.m., with cemetery blessing to follow (Sacred Heart only).

Wednesday, July 5, at SHDC, 5:30 p.m., with cemetery blessing to follow (Harris, only)

Next week:

Tuesday, July 11, at ICC, 8 a.m., with cemetery blessing to follow.

Tuesday, July 12, at SMH, with cemetery blessing to follow.

Again: the Church provides special Masses for the needs of the civic community, even outside of 4th of July. And we're going to have to stretch out 4th of July this year.

More About Fr. Jim Pallardy. He was born on December 8, 1960, so he's getting close to 63 years old. Father Pallardy was ordained on May 23, 1987, so we're talking 36 years ordained. We're currently looking into travel to Springfield and Peoria on Sunday, July 23, to pay a visit to two beautiful Cathedrals, stop for a few meals, and pave the way for a possible return sometime in the fall. But as things stand now, we need to know by July 10 who's coming along.

Called and Gifted Workshop / Charismatic Gifts Survey. We're happy to announce that our Called and Gifted Workshop from St. Catherine of Siena Institute will take place on September 30, 2023. Mary Martin and Father Brent Bowen, OP, will be the presenters. This is open to all parishioners, and it is hoped that many will sign on to attend. There is a registration fee of \$20 to cover the cost of materials for the day; and in August and September, there are some on-line presentations that participants will have to tap into. For anyone who has already been a part of Called and Gifted, whether as a participant or as a facilitator, we encourage you to sign up again for this revised and updated presentation. Overall costs for this opportunity will be satisfied through a grant; we don't anticipate additional expenses. But if there are any, our churches will pay according to the number of registered families in the churches, i.e., a pro-rated system. We will provide more exact information as we near the September 30 event.
