The parish office will be closed this week, July 3-July 7 to allow for some parish staff off-time. In light of this, I am also going to take the opportunity to head to Chicago for the week to do some research for my S.T.L. ("License in Sacred Theology") thesis which I have recently resumed working on and hope to have done this fall. There will be no Mass on Monday (7/3) or Friday (7/7) morning. Fr. Zach Samples from St. Peter's will be in on the morning of July 4 and at Good Samaritan Home on Thursday (7/6), Fr. Blickhan will have Mass on Wednesday evening, and Deacon Harry Cramer will have a Communion Service on Thursday. The voice mail system will be

monitored over the week if there are any items that need to be dealt with in a timely way, and all will return to normal next weekend.

On Monday, July 10, we will 'open our books' for Mass intentions in 2024. These



'intentions' are for the deceased who are often mentioned during Mass, "for whom this Mass is offered'. It is a laudable custom to pray for the dead and to ask to have the 'ministerial Intentions fruits' of the Mass offered for the repose of the souls of the departed, and for other worthy intentions.

While scrupulously trying to avoid any impression of commerce, it is customary to make an offering of \$10 for a Mass intention. (Those who are unable to pay, the lack of an offering is, in itself, not to be a barrier for asking for having an intention offered at Mass.) While we do our best to accommodate date requests for specific intentions, we cannot guarantee or reserve particular dates. If there is a request for specific dates, we take them on a 'first-come first-served' basis. We do ask that when multiple intentions are being scheduled that they be divided somewhat evenly between weekend and weekday dates. Finally, we do ask that for major Holy Days (Christmas, Easter) that a particular intention or family only appear once every third year, in order to make these dates accessible to others who might want to choose that date. When we schedule an intention, it is with the understanding that our schedule can and does change on occasion, and when a date cannot be honored (because Mass is not being celebrated or it is being re-scheduled), we will do our best to accommodate other dates and choices... please be patient and cooperative with our parish staff when that need arises. Each Sunday and Holy Day a "Mass for the People", for all the living and deceased of the parish is celebrated, which calls to mind all of the faithful in the parish. Further questions can be directed to the parish office (217) 222-5996.

On Sunday, July 9, St. Peter's Church will host the annual procession to Fr. Tolton's



grave. The procession will start from St. Peter's Church at 4:00 p.m. and conclude with Evening Prayer at 4:30 p.m. at the gravesite. The walk is about one mile. Those who are unable to make the walk may meet the procession at the cemetery. Due to the lack of space, it is requested that nobody should park in the cemetery itself. Chairs and bottled water will be available at the cemetery.

Finally, last week I mentioned how so many contributions came together to help us to finish out the fiscal year. The inspiration to write that article came from my desire to thank the local Knights of Columbus publicly for the gift that came to St. Dominic School... and then I completely

forgot to mention this particular gift! I'm sorry!

As you probably know, the Knights concluded a well-publicized raffle that gave away in excess of \$100,000 to a lucky winner. That prize represented about 1/2 of the pot from the raffle. From 'their half' of the pot, the Knights have elected to share generously with the charities and organizations they support, including each of the Quincy Catholic Schools. I wish to thank the Knights for their generosity and acknowledge their gift of \$8,000 which we



applied to our pension obligations. I don't do this often enough, but this is a good time and place to endorse the work of the Knights and to ask our men to consider becoming a member of the Knights of Columbus, if they are not already members. Our Knights very generously support the weekly TV Mass which is broadcast across the viewing area each Sunday morning, along with providing support to seminarians and college Newman Clubs, pro-life charities and ministries, scholarships to our local Catholic Schools, along with other fraternal benefit and insurance programs. Thank you once again from a grateful parish and school community. Vivat Jesus!




