2 Kings 4:8-11,14-16a; Romans 6:3-4,8-11;
Matthew 10:37-42

Elisha succeeded Elijah as the great prophet in Israel in the ninth century before Christ. Remember that a prophet is not a predictor of the future, but a spokesman for God to call people back to God through repentance and faith. The couple at Shunem offer hospitality to Elisha, not so much because he is a *friend* as because he is a *prophet*.

In the Gospel, Jesus tells us that we must not prefer anything to him. The person who seeks only his own selfish goals will bring himself to ruin; he will lose his immortal soul.

He goes on to tell us that our faith must go beyond mere friendship: We must accept those who are sent by God precisely because they are sent by God, and not because we happen to like them. Personalism and human friendship is wonderful; but our faith must go beyond this.

In his epistles, Paul invents new words. He wants to show that the Christian is completely identified with Christ. What happens to Christ must happen to the Christian. He says we are “conjoined” to Christ by baptism; we become “co-bodies” with him; we are “co-buried” with him in baptism; we must therefore rise in him.

The meaning of the Christian life is to live out Christ’s life: We offer our lives in union with him to the Father; we suffer with him; we rejoice in him; we die in him; and therefore, since we belong completely to Christ, we must rise gloriously in him.

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, July 2, 2023

Dear Parishioners,

With tongue in cheek, I welcome our new month of July. Sad to say goodbye to June as it means a month of summer vacation is now concluded. Oh well, time flies when you are having fun, right?

As we gather to worship on this 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time in our second reading for our Mass this weekend, we find a reading often used at so many funeral Masses. In this reading, St. Paul reminds the Romans as well as each of us that our baptisms meant that you and I have been immersed into the Paschal Mysteries, namely, Jesus' death and resurrection. Paul tells us that "if we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with Him." If that is the case, then Paul reminds us that "we must think of ourselves as dead to sin and living for God in Christ Jesus." In other words, Baptism has changed each of us. Are we living in Christ as our Baptisms celebrated, or are we continuing to cling onto the things of this world with all their empty promises and foolish attractions? But what is presented to you is a vision of what could be if we have all the funds in the world. But we don't. And so we want to hear from you concerning this vision. That is why we have enlisted the Steier group to assist us in fashioning this vision to meet our needs and capabilities. You received a survey with the brochure and I hope that you fill it out and return it to us. Some parishioners have been interviewed and others are pending. I have no set agenda. You have been so good in embracing stewardship that I wanted to use our resources wisely in order to benefit all. People have been concerned about the QCES proposals, but our vision for our capital improvements are to assist St. Peter Church and parishioners regardless of these proposals. In fact, whatever is built will only enhance our school building for any future endeavors. As I told you in a previous column, I could easily sit back and not do anything but I have recognized some needs in our parish and this vision is a response to those needs. But I promise you that I will not impose a burden on this parish that I have grown to love and together we will meet the needs of the future for our parish and school. May God bless you and continue to help you be those stewards of time, talents, and treasures.

Just a reminder that 4th of July is a national holiday and that we will be having only our 8:00 a.m. Mass for that day. This day is a day for which we can gather to thank our God for the freedoms that we enjoy. We live in a country richly blessed by our God. CAMPAIGN PLANNING STUDY



DEAR PARISHIONERS,

You may have heard and should have received a packet of information about a planning study St. Peter has started, just this past week. The study will provide our leadership valuable feedback about projects proposed for our parish and about the possibility of a major fundraising effort. We've hired the Steier Group, a Catholic fundraising firm, to conduct the study.

Here are details:

What is a planning study?

The study gauges support for the proposed projects and for a potential major fundraising effort called a capital campaign. The study, which lasts about five weeks, also will help identify possible volunteer leaders and set a financial goal should the parish choose to move forward with a campaign.

How will the study determine whether there is support?

The study involves surveying the entire St. Peter community. The Steier Group will administer the study and survey. The firm will compile your feedback and present it to our parish leadership. We will then make an informed decision about the projects and a potential campaign. Hiring an experienced, professional development firm like the Steier Group ensures an effective and successful planning study.

Why should we conduct a planning study?

Many churches use planning studies when considering a fundraising campaign. It is a wise first step. That's because the study provides valuable information on how everyone feels about the proposed projects and a potential capital campaign.

What is a capital campaign?

A capital campaign is a fundraising effort for big projects and needs, such as major renovations, new buildings and eliminating debt. Capital campaigns fund specific projects and needs. They are not for regular, ongoing costs, such as salaries and utility bills.

What do you expect of church members during the planning study?

Initially, we will be asking only for your feedback and prayers. Your input and participation will help us make wise decisions about the projects and a potential campaign. You will be hearing more about how you can participate in the coming weeks.

Tolton Procession

This year's annual Pilgrimage Procession to the grave of the Venerable Servant of God Father Augustine Tolton, the first publicly-recognized Black priest in the USA, will take place on July 9, the 126th anniversary of his death. The pilgrimage procession will leave from the statue of Father Tolton outside St. Peter's church in Quincy at 4:00 p.m. and walk to his grave, about a mile away, for the praying of Evening Prayer at 4:30 p.m. Those who cannot participate in the walk may meet the procession at the cemetery. Due to lack of space, no one should park in the cemetery itself. Chairs and bottled water will be provided at the cemetery.
