Isaiah 55:10-11; Romans 8:18-23;
Matthew 13:1-23

About this time of year, the “Plains States” complete the wheat harvest. Some farmers get a good yield of forty bushels to the acre. If you told a farmer that he could get a yield of more than 200 bushels to the acre, he would say that you are nutty as a peach orchard owl!

Yet that is what Jesus promises in the parable of today’s Gospel: The seed which fell on good ground yielded a hundred-fold; that would be about 250 bushels to the acre!

Parables were simple stories with a strange twist. People loved them because they were simple, and because of the strange or weird or spectacular twist. The point of the parable is that God’s word can do spectacular things – if we are the “good ground.” And God’s grace can do absolutely nothing for the person who closes his heart to God!

All that we have and all that we are that is good comes from God. He is the giver of every good gift. But there is a catch: He expects a return on his investment in us. If he has lavished his grace and blessing on us, he expects that we shall bear good fruit.

The second reading tells us that all the sufferings of this world are as nothing when compared with the unending joy which awaits us in heaven. We may suffer for a time, but we shall live eternally, if we are the good ground if we seek to bear a good harvest.
