# Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

JULY 23, 2023

Wisdom 12:13,16-19; Romans 8:26-27; Matthew 13:24-43

At times, we are tempted to want God to destroy our enemies. Like the apostles, we want to call down fire from heaven to consume the evil doers. But that is not God's way!

No other religion in the world preaches compassion and mercy and forgiveness for the evil doer as does genuine Christianity. Among others, justice and retribution are swift and decisive.

Our God is not like that. He shows his power most perfectly in his mercy! He forgives the unforgivable in order to draw all people to himself. Our first reading, from Wisdom, describes this lovingkindness.

The Gospel is the parable of the wheat and the weeds. The word for "weeds" in the original language is for a specific weed, called darnel. Darnel looked very much like wheat in its early growth; it even headed out like wheat, but it was poison.

If we wanted to make an allegory out of the parable, we could say that often a religious spirit can be "faked." Evil often masquerades as good, so we must be cautious.

But a deeper message is that God permits evil to exist with a hope for the conversion of the evil doer. The existence of evil in the world should challenge the Christian to a stronger faith – and to greater mercy in order to be like God.

The second reading should give us confidence: The Holy Spirit is within us. Through him, we are empowered to withstand evil and to be strong in the face of weakness.

While Fr. Leo is away to enjoy some well-deserved R&R, he has asked that I share a few words with you in this weekend's bulletin column. So here goes!


Over the course of this next year, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops have encouraged us to engage in a year of Eucharistic Revival. Research polls tell us that not only are Catholics by and large not attending Mass regularly, they also do not believe in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. Sacred Scripture, the Catechism, the teachings of the Church, and the words of Jesus Himself make things quite clear. He left us His Body and Blood so that we might be able to experience His love and that we might be His hands and feet in our families, our neighborhoods, and our world.

In this year of Eucharistic Revival, I encourage each of us to grow closer to our Lord, especially as He is present in the Blessed Sacrament. First and foremost, I encourage each of us to redouble our efforts to be present at Mass each and every Sunday. Whether you are spending the weekend at home with your family or traveling to the four winds, Weekend Mass attendance must be our top priority. It is an obligation and it is a Commandment, but it is so much more than that. Viewing Mass attendance as solely an obligation or as a commandment doesn't really capture the fullness of what it is. It is time for us to come together as the Body of Christ, to worship Christ in our midst as a community of faith, and to, as Jesus says, "Do this in memory of me" as we receive His Body and Blood—as we receive His love. We gather to give thanks for our joys, to offer up our pains, and to grow deeper into His love.

Here at St. Peter, we have many opportunities to grow closer to Jesus and deepen our understanding and appreciation of the Eucharist. This coming Tuesday night from 6:30-7:30 p.m., Deacon Jayke will offer his final talk on the Eucharist. This will be done in the context of Adoration. Speaking of Adoration, our Adoration Chapel is looking to fill a few more spots. See the bulletin for the remaining openings, and call Mary Voorhis at 217-653-3127 or call/text Gina Wolf at 217-257-9966 to get signed up. Please also consider joining us at the BOS Center in Springfield on Saturday, October 28 for our Diocesan Eucharistic Congress. This event will feature speakers on the Eucharist, including Fr. Denis Robinson, OSB, who gave our Advent Parish Mission earlier this year. If you are interested in joining us, please contact the Parish Office by July 28.
