

**Updating Cemetery Records As Needed.** We are currently working with the state of Illinois to ensure that our cemeteries are in compliance with State guidelines and directives. Our thanks go out to our parishioners who have diligently and faithfully kept records, worked with funeral home directors and families, and the cemetery grounds for the sake of the sacred ground in which are buried the faithful departed.

#### **Registration for "Called and Gifted" Begins!**

All of our Masses are now informed about "Called and Gifted," the discernment of gifts of the Holy Spirit infused into our souls at Baptism, and intended for sharing with others to advance the Church, the Body of Christ. The Called and Gifted Workshop takes place on Saturday, September 30, from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. We intend to have a specific, limited window of time for registration: the closing date for registration is July 31. During the months of August and September, registered participants will view a video, and take the Called and Gifted Inventory, both online, thus preparing ourselves for the workshop.

This year we will publish the following weeks topic so that anyone who wishes to bone up on a particular subject is welcome to attend without committing to the whole year. RCIA takes place on Sundays from 4:30-6:30 p.m. at the Immaculate Conception parish hall. Each session begins with a 20-minute session on the treasury of the Church, prayers and life of a Saint, followed by a 40-minute teaching session.
