1 Kings 3:5,7-12; Romans 8:28-30; Matthew 13:44-52

Solomon was King David's son by Bathsheba. When he became king, he was overwhelmed by the number of people and the problems of ruling. When asked by God what one gift he desired, Solomon answered "an understanding heart." He prayed for real wisdom.

The lesson of the Gospel parable is that we should be willing to give everything we have if we find the greatest value of life.

In the ancient Middle East there were constant wars. (So what else is new?) A person wouldn't trust banks, for they might be taken over by an invader. If you had a treasure, you might bury it in a secret place on your land.

But suppose your family or clan was wiped out; generations later someone might discover the treasure you buried. That person would seek to buy the land before anyone else found out about it.

What is the greatest value of our lives? It is wisdom which puts everything in its proper place. True wisdom proceeds from faith. Faith sees that this world is important, but the world to come is more important. True wisdom orients everything in life toward our eternal goal of heaven.

True wisdom trusts God, even when things seem bleak. The second reading reminds us that all things will work together for good for those who love the Lord. Let us pray for true wisdom. Let us work each day for that wisdom which sees God's gracious purpose working in our lives, a wisdom which seeks to please him at every moment.

Dear Parishioners,

This year the Catholic Church in the United States is undergoing a year of Eucharistic Revival. This is largely motivated by the fact that Mass attendance is significantly down nationwide, and research suggests that many Catholics do not believe in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. As part of this Eucharistic Revival, we will participate in initiatives on both the Diocesan and Parish levels.

On the Diocesan level, the Diocesan Eucharistic Congress that will be taking place at the BOS Center in Springfield on Saturday, October 28. You might be asking yourself, "What is a Eucharistic Congress?" It's basically just a fancy way of saying "Conference." Essentially, this is an opportunity to deepen our understanding and appreciation of the Eucharist through conference talks, adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, and Mass. Our Parish has been allotted 202 tickets to this event. So far, only 62 Parishioners have signed up to attend, so please do prayerfully consider joining us. Please contact us ASAP at church@cospq.org or 217-222-3155 to sign up.

Here on the Parish level, I have some exciting news to share. Twice per month, our Grade School students will be partaking in Eucharistic Adoration here in Church. We are in need of volunteers to join our students in prayer to make sure that there is always someone present in the Church while the Eucharist is exposed. If you are interested in praying with our students, please contact Gina Bergman at g.bergman@cospq.org or 217-214-0182. As I mentioned last week, our own Adoration Chapel is still in need of additional Adorers. See the bulletin for details.

I am ecstatic to share that both Fr. Kolbe Wolniakowski, OSB and Fr. Denis Robinson, OSB, have agreed to come back for Parish Missions this year! These are way in advance, but please do "Save the Date." Fr. Kolbe will be here for an Advent Parish Mission from December 2-December 5, 2023, and Fr. Denis will be here for a Lenten Parish Mission from February 24-February 26, 2024. Both Missions will be centered on the Eucharist. I hope to see you there!

Not to sound like a broken record, but to conclude this section on the Eucharistic Revival, I want to encourage each of us to redouble our efforts to be present at Mass every Sunday. This is essential. Whether your family is spending the weekend at home, or traveling over the river and through the woods, there are always Mass times available. As I've said, this is beyond "commandment" and "obligation." It is both, but it is so much more. It is love, surrender, peace, and keeping our priorities in order: God first...everything else second.

Recently, I've been asked what my thoughts are on "rowdy" kids in Church. To be completely frank with you, I am overjoyed every time I hear a baby cry or a kid scream. You might even see me smile and look over in the general direction of said crying baby or screaming child. This is for a simple reason: a Church without crying children during Mass is a dying Church. Now, this is a balance, to be sure. I understand sometimes a child is just plain inconsolable. That is why we have a cry room and a narthex available. Aside from that, I encourage each of us to thank our young couples for bringing their kids to Mass. It is an absolute joy to see kids in Church!


