

#### **Growing Disciples Still Progressing**

Sometimes, when you are in the midst of an extended discernment process involving an entire diocese, there are "gaps." By that, I mean stretches of time in which we hear little. Let's review some of the features of Growing Disciples, so that we're on track with its progress.

Remember our Bishop's foundations. First, Evangelization: to share our faith, and to both speak about and listen to our experiences of Jesus Christ. Second, the Eucharist: the urgency and desperation of the Holy Trinity to mingle Jesus Christ's Risen Body with ours in Holy Communion. Third, Discipleship: a following of...imitating...becoming one with...and allowing to work through us: Jesus Christ. Fourth, Vocation: we all have one! A call from Jesus Christ to serve Him! Finally, Archbishop Fulton Sheen: to enter into his teachings as the Holy Spirit directs his beatification and canonization as a saint.

We are in Phase III (ending in the spring of 2024) of a four-phase process (concluding in 2026). Clergy meetings; lay representative meetings; vicariate boundary re-assessment. They proposed exactly what we've been doing up to this point! Another round of clergy / laity meetings begins in late August, with the Bishop meeting with our area clergy. **Extended 4th of July Continues.** Tuesday, October 11t, 8 a.m. Mass and Cemetery Blessing to follow, at ICC; and 5:30 p.m. Mass and Cemetery Blessing to follow, at SMH. Our Masses will lift up in sacrifice and thanksgiving, our nation in remembrance of her founding.

**Timetable for Fr. Jim Pallardy.** Planning a move within a short period of time isn't the best of ideas. We're going to give Fr. Jim a little more time than originally planned. We said he'd come after July 4, anyway. So, let's say July 17. And remember: we're going to let him "ease in" during the summer.

**Spanish Mass.** Sunday, July 9th, is the second Sunday of the month - the Sunday we celebrate our Spanish Mass at ICC, at 5pm. (By the way: our Spanish choir will be singing the Acclamations at our August 14th ICC Outdoor Mass and Blessing of our Parish Hall and Our Lady of Guadalupe Shrine!)

Clean Up After the Storm: Tremendous Turnout. All of our churches had to contend with minor damage - except for Nauvoo. SPPN and SPPS had to contend with major storm damage to roofs and trees. We had people at SPPN and SPPs on Thursday, immediately after the storm; and then they returned on Friday and did wonderful work cleaning the rectory area; and then on Sunday, perhaps over sixty volunteers to help with the monumental task of cleaning up our school property. These people put their own needs on hold; some carried on, on their own time, with what they did at work, with the greater communities' cleanup. More school cleanup needed: date to be announced. Prayers, everyone, for our parishioners and for all who have suffered property damage, loss of power, and significant waiting for cleanup and restoration. And a huge "thank you" for all the help we've received, from our own parishioners, and from good neighbors at every turn!

#### Conclusion of the Annual Diocesan Appeal, 2022.

SPPN: 49 donors have given \$23,080 of the \$23,380 pledged. The goal was \$32,878. SPPN will pay \$9,798 to meet the goal. ICC: 37 donors have given \$19,395 of the \$19,415 pledged. The goal was \$27,409. ICC will pay \$8,014 to meet the goal. SHDC: 30 donors have given \$9,130 of the \$9,230 pledged. The goal was \$11,595. SHDC will pay \$2,465 to meet the goal. SHW: 20 donors have given \$7,145 of the \$7,500 pledged. The goal was \$14, 932. SHW will pay \$7,787 to meet the goal. SMH: 28 donors have given \$8,005 of the \$8,030 pledged. The goal was \$13,348. SMH will pay \$5,343 to meet the goal.

But as things stand now, we need to know by July 10 who's coming along.

Called and Gifted Workshop / Charismatic Gifts Survey. We're happy to announce that our Called and Gifted Workshop from St. Catherine of Siena Institute will take place on September 30, 2023. Mary Martin and Father Brent Bowen, OP, will be the presenters. This is open to all parishioners, and it is hoped that many will sign on to attend. There is a registration fee of \$20 to cover the cost of materials for the day; and in August and September, there are some on-line presentations that participants will have to tap into. For anyone who has already been a part of Called and Gifted, whether as a participant or as a facilitator, we encourage you to sign up again for this revised and updated presentation. Overall costs for this opportunity will be satisfied through a grant; we don't anticipate additional expenses. But if there are any, our churches will pay according to the number of registered families in the churches, i.e., a pro-rated system. We will provide more exact information as we near the September 30 event.

Healing Service, St. Mary Church, Hamilton, Saturday Evening, July 22. During the last participation in the Called and Gifted Charismatic Gifts effort under Fr. Szydlik's leadership, a Raritan parishioner, Roger Shaner, heard Fr. Szydlik's sermon about sharing our spiritual gifts. He had known that he had a gift for healing: spiritual, emotional, and physical. Both Fr. Szydlik and I can testify as personal witnesses to Mr. Shaner's spiritual gift: we've seen healings - yes, even physical healings, both partial and complete. For this reason, after the Saturday evening Mass in Hamilton on July 22, at around 6:30 p.m., we will begin a monthly Healing Service which will include the healing ministry of Roger Shaner, intercessory prayer to Father Augustus Tolton and Bishop Fulton Sheen (in the event of a physical healing that would advance their causes for canonization), and the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. You are invited to benefit from Mr. Shaner's ministry; but you are certainly encouraged to come and be present in intercessory prayer for the work of the Holy Spirit to cover the movement of the entire evening. Once again: Saturday evening, July 22, St. Mary Church, Hamilton, immediately after the 5:30 p.m. Mass. (This is a legitimate feature of the prayer and worship life of the Catholic Church.)
