Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary 7ime

JULY 9, 2023

Zechariah 9:9-10; Romans 8:9,11-13; Matthew 11:25-30

The first eight chapters of Zechariah date from 520 B.C. and concern the rebuilding of the temple after the Babylonian Captivity. But the last six chapters (from which today's first reading is taken) come from the time of Alexander the Great, i.e. around 333 B.C.

Alexander was young, arrogant, and brash. He was a great general, and he knew it. He intended to unite the entire world under his leadership! He loved to rub his enemies noses in the dirt and parade them in disgrace before his victorious army. In contrast, Zechariah sees a humble leader, one who will not come with force of weapons, but who will ride on the back of a donkey. His dominion will be one of peace and justice.

At the time of Jesus, many Jews were expecting a military Messiah, one who would establish the kingdom by force and power. Jesus says that we should learn of him, for he is gentle and humble of heart. He invites those who are burdened with life to come to him. His voke will fit us well; it will not be like the yoke of a harsh task-master. He offers us rest.

The second reading is from the most consoling chapter in the entire Bible. Read it in its entirety! Today's selection reminds us that the spirit of Christ dwells in our hearts. We are not doomed to live according to the lowest and the meanest and the weakest.

("Flesh" means "following that tug downwards of original sin.") We are empowered to live in the "spirit" - in the st ength of Christ's grace. With that grace, we can shoulder any burden.

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, July 9, 2023

Dear Parishioners,

We continue to celebrate "Ordinary Time" as this is the 14th Sunday in this liturgical season. I find our gospel this Sunday one of the most comforting gospels that we have. We find Jesus stating those comforting words when He states: "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light." As I think about those words, it would have been nice if Jesus would have said, "I will take the yoke from you and relieve you of it." But He didn't. That yoke that we all carry is the various crosses in life that we have. Some of these crosses are quite burdensome, others are often nuisances. But Jesus didn't say that He was going to take them away. All He said, basically, is learn from Him and the cross that He carried. If we do that, then we find Jesus helping us each day to carry whatever cross that we have in life. He will assist us in our struggles and with Him at our side, then "the yoke is easy, and the burden is light." Let's pray that whatever the weight of our yokes that we find Jesus walking with us as we journey on our individual roads to Calvary. And whatever we suffer, let's offer it in union with Christ for the salvation of others. I can remember as a young boy, dealing with the struggles of growing up, the sage advice of my mother who would say, "offer it up for others."

Just to let you know that I will be leaving for vacation this Tuesday, July 11 and will return ten days later on Friday, July 21. Then that following Sunday, July 23, I will be heading out again for my annual trek to Frankenmuth, Michigan. I should be back on Friday, July 28. I ask for your prayers.

This next weekend, in conjunction with the Missionary Co-Op appeal, we will be having a priest speak at all of our Masses asking our help in his particular diocese, that of the Archdiocese of Mbarara in Africa. I ask you to welcome Fr. Charles Niwagaba and give him your full attention. He will be asking us to fulfill what it means to be "Catholic" in the sense that the Church is "universal." And so he will be appealing to that universality of our Church asking us to support the efforts in his diocese to bring the gospel of Jesus to his people. There will be Missionary Co-Op envelopes in the pews next weekend for you to use as we respond to his appeal through our generosity.

This Sunday, July 9, there will be the annual procession to the grave of Venerable Servant of God, Fr. Augustine Tolton. This day is the 126th anniversary of his death. You are invited to share in this day with a pilgrimage to his grave in St. Peter Cemetery. Our celebration will begin at the statue of Venerable Servant of God at St. Peter Church at 4:00 p.m. and then process down Maine Street to 33rd and then into St. Peter Cemetery. At the grave we will have Evening Prayer. Please come and join us for this special remembrance.

You are also invited to come and listen to Deacon Jayke White, our transitional deacon who is with us this summer. He will be speaking on the Eucharist in a series of three talks beginning this Tuesday, July 11, and then the next two Tuesdays, July 18 and 25. The talks will be in Church from 6:30-7:30 p.m.

Tolton Procession

This year's annual Pilgrimage Procession to the grave of the Venerable Servant of God Father Augustine Tolton, the first publicly-recognized Black priest in the USA, will take place on July 9, the 126th anniversary of his death. The pilgrimage procession will leave from the statue of Father Tolton outside St. Peter's church in Quincy at 4:00 p.m. and walk to his grave, about a mile away, for the praying of Evening Prayer at 4:30 p.m. Those who cannot participate in the walk may meet the procession at the cemetery. Due to lack of space, no one should park in the cemetery itself. Chairs and bottled water will be provided at the cemetery.
