Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

AUGUST 13, 2023

1 Kings 19:9a,11-13a; Romans 9:1-5;
Matthew 14:22-33

If we have faith, God will see that we overcome any obstacle. The setting of today's first reading is Elijah's dejection. After he had defeated the prophets of Baal, Queen Jezebel set out to kill him.

Discouraged and depressed, Elijah escapes to the Sinai desert. No one is faithful to God any more, and he wants to die. God sets him down and shows him powerful signs.

But God is not in these powerful displays. Finally, in a gentle breeze, Elijah encounters God. The message: Don't look for spectacles; you will find God in the peace of your soul; from there he will triumph over all difficulties.

The background of the Gospel is actually the setting of the Church of around 80 A.D. Christians had been expelled from the Synagogue. They were now outlaws to the Romans. They were persecuted and killed.

The Church is seen as a boat being tossed about in a storm. Jesus comes walking on the water. The disciples can't believe it is he. As a test, Peter is invited to walk on the water. He loses faith and begins to sink.

Jesus saves him and says that if he had faith he could do what Jesus did. Jesus gets into the boat and calms the storm. The lesson: the Church can weather any storm if we only have faith.

In the second reading, Paul is in agony because his fellow Jews do not accept Jesus. He, too, must learn to trust and to have faith that God's will will be accomplished.

Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, August 13, 2023

Dear Parishioners,

In our journey of faith, one common denominator we all have is our desire to seek God in our lives. If only God would reveal Himself to us, perhaps we might have more reassurance of our faith. If only we could experience His presence in our lives, perhaps then we might have more confidence in following Him. We all would like to be in God's presence and feel that presence. In our first reading today from the Book of Kings, we hear of a prophet named Elijah who had that same desire that we have. Elijah desired to be in the presence of His God and sought Him in differing elements in life. As he took shelter in a cave, Elijah was told that God would be passing by. Then differing elements of nature were made present, and yet God was not in any of them. From strong and heavy winds to earthquakes and fires, all phenomena which for most of us would think God was being made manifest in these elements of nature. But He wasn't present in any of them. What we are told was that Elijah experienced God in a tiny whispering sound. Unbelievable! Who would imagine that the all powerful, transcendent God, would be made manifest in a tiny whispering sound. What does this tell you about our God? For me, it tells me that our God doesn't fit into any particular mode. He comes to us in many simple and small ways. Let us be thankful to this God for He breaks the mold of human expectations and comes to us in ways that we may never understand.

This weekend, the Church celebrates the 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time. As we reflect upon this "ordinary time", perhaps the ordinary part reveals to us what Elijah experienced, namely that our God comes to us, is present in our lives, in some very ordinary experiences that we often miss. I pray this weekend that each of you will find our God especially in this Eucharist in which simple elements of bread and wine are changed into the Body and Blood of Christ. That's called His Real Presence. And there is nothing better than to experience this presence each and every Sunday.

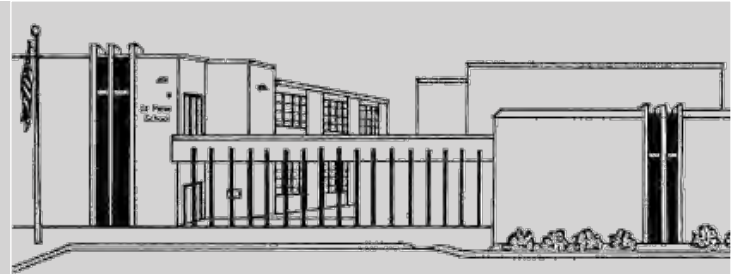

May each of them discover the presence of God in the tiny whispering sounds that fill our hallways and classrooms. This Tuesday, August 15, is the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary into heaven and is a Holyday of Obligation for all Catholics. In this Solemnity, we honor Mary who most perfectly embodies lowliness and humility.
