

From the Pastor's Desk

Today the Church celebrates the 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time. The 1st Reading is from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah. Isaiah's focus is on the Gentiles, "foreigners." Gentiles who "join themselves to the Lord," God says "I will bring to my holy mountain and make joyful in my house of prayer." This house of prayer is certainly alluding to the Jerusalem Temple. According to Isaiah, the sacrificial offerings of the Gentiles in the Temple will be acceptable to the Lord. This is pretty unusual thinking for traditional Judaism of the Old Testament.

In the Gospel, a Gentile woman comes to Jesus asking for a healing miracle of exorcism for her daughter. Jesus initially puts her off, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." Yet the woman's faith and perseverance are striking; she is quick witted and will not give up. Jesus seems genuinely intrigued by her confidence and zeal, "O woman, great is your faith!" And the miracle is granted for her daughter.

We do not know why Jesus initially turns down this woman. Did Jesus grow in His own self-knowledge of His mission, or did He intentionally maneuver the conversation in an attempt to draw out her faith. Good question. We simply admire her confidence in not giving up; she knew her daughter was counting on her. In the end, Jesus accomplishes what Isaiah prophesies in the First Reading. The offerings (pleadings) of foreigners will indeed be acceptable!

7:45 the 7th street alley entrance closes.


8:15 the 8th street alley entrance closes. The parking lot should be used only for those attending morning Mass or walking their children into school.


