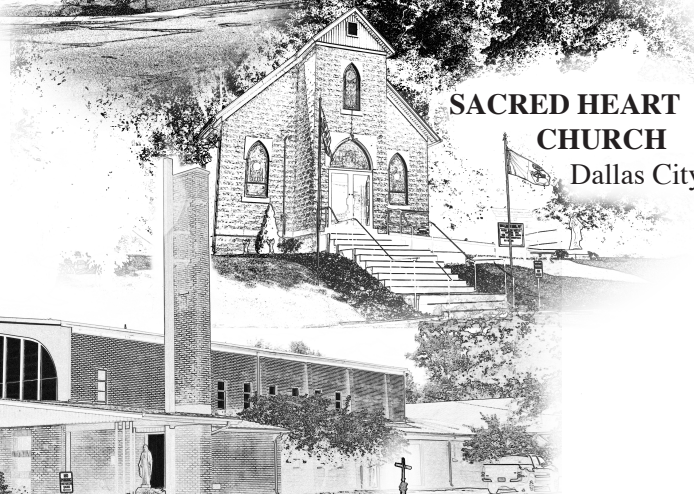

**Growing Disciples Update.** Lay leadership representatives are being invited to a one-day retreat as a part of this ongoing discernment process.
