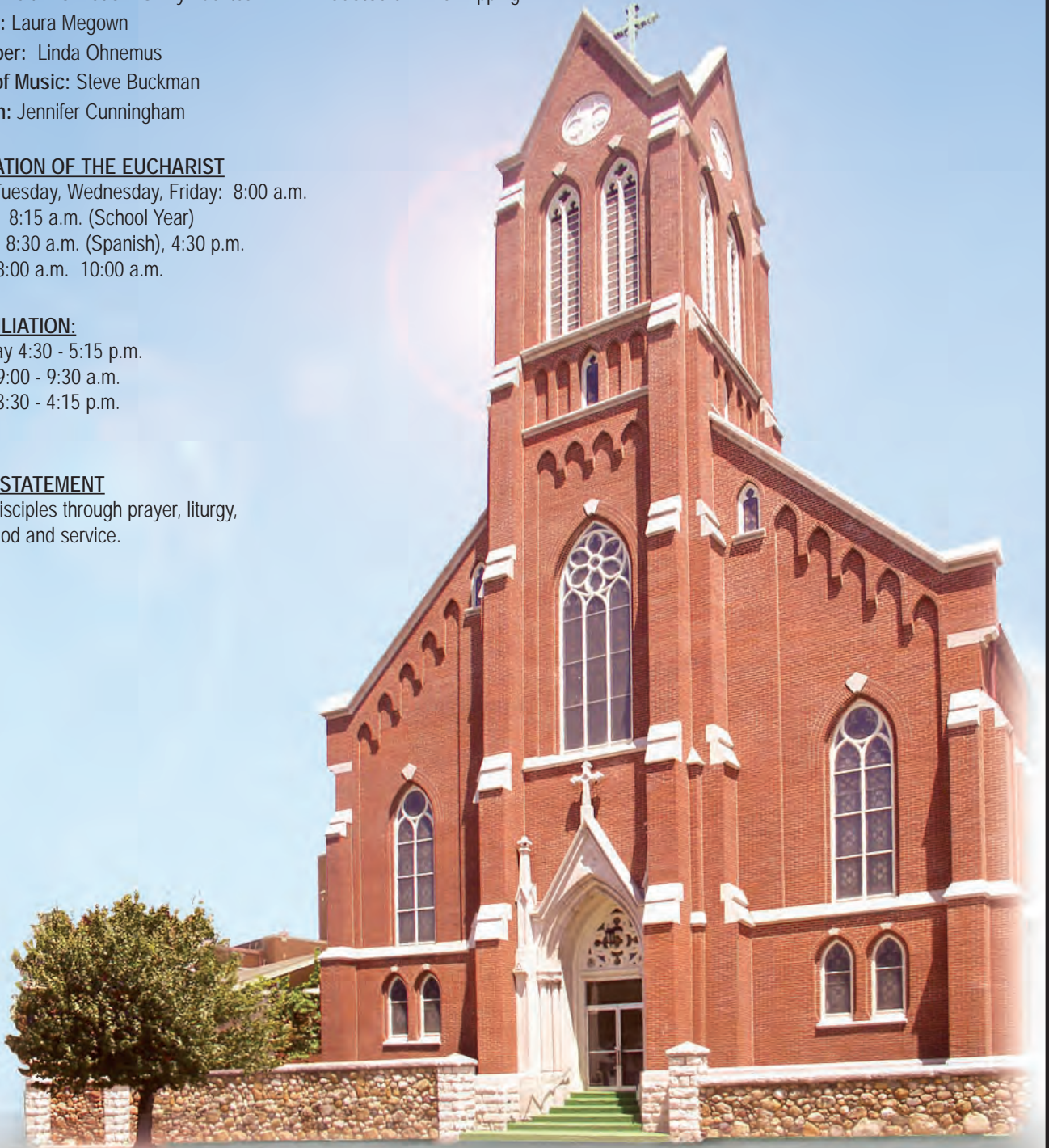

Today we celebrate the **23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time**. Our 1st Reading is from the Book of the Prophet Ezekiel. The Lord has appointed Ezekiel as a watchman for the house of Israel. His mission is to listen for God's messages and warn Israel accordingly. The Lord is especially concerned that the prophet warn those whose behavior is "wicked." Even though it may cause hardship on the prophet, he is commissioned to speak out "to dissuade the wicked from his way." If the prophet fails to do speak out, the prophet is as responsible as the one acting immorally. If the prophet does speak out, yet the wicked fails to change, the prophet is no longer held responsible.

In the Gospel reading, Jesus gives his famous teaching on fraternal correction. If a brother sins against you, Jesus gives us a 4-step process:

1. Go and tell him his fault between you and him alone.
2. If he does not listen, take one or two others along with you.
3. If he refuses to listen to them, tell the church.
4. If he refuses to listen to the church, then treat him as you would a Gentile or tax collector.

The two readings have in common the need to speak up when we see a behavior in a brother or sister that is concerning and need of correction. This requires a great deal of prayer and soul searching when considering what and when to say something. We ask the Lord to speak to our hearts what it is that He wants us to say.

This coming Friday, September 15 Blessed Sacrament School is taking a **Vocation Trip** to the St. Louis area with our 5th and 6th Grade students. We will be visiting 4 locations: (1) Alton Convent of the Franciscan Sisters of the Martyr St. George, (2) Kenrick-Glennon Seminary, (3) Carmelite Monastery, and (3) St. Louis Benedictine Abbey. We will have with us Sr. Karolyn Nunes FSGM who will act as our tour guide throughout the day. The purpose of this trip is to give our students exposure to many different types of religious life to which the Lord may be calling them. I hope we will have a marvelous, joy-filled trip!

Finally, next weekend is **Catechetical Sunday**. Next weekend we honor the many catechists in our parish who share the gift of faith formation and education to children and adults throughout our parish and school. At each of the Masses we will bless our catechists and thank them for their ministry and their daily witness to their faith. May the peace of Christ be with you all,

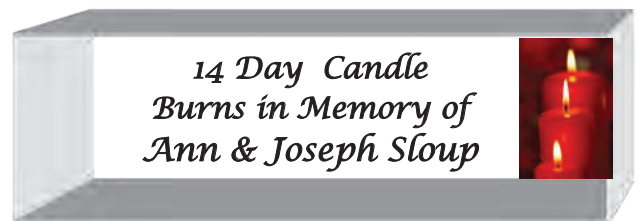

This mission appeal is to the special needs children, those who are mentally and physically disabled. The project is taken care of by religious sisters. Their motto is "FROM DEPENDENCE TO INDEPENDENCE". This project is a help to enhance these children to manage their lives independently. These religious sisters run a special school for them (blind, lame & poor with intellectual capacity). The parents of these children are poor and hence can't provide for them and give them proper education. As a result, some parents leave them on the street. These differently-abled children neither have a proper shelter nor food nor basic facilities. There are some children who have become a burden to the parents who are economically poor. The parents could not give required attention to the disabled children. Sisters provide these children education with boarding facilities, medical care. Since good care and special attention is given to each child, children are being brought from far-a-way places. The available resources are not sufficient for the increasing number. Therefore, your generous heart to this great mission will be of great help to many children. Please be as generous towards children's education. May God bless you!
