SEPTEMBER 10, 2023

Ezekiel 33:7-9; Romans 13:8-10; Matthew 18:15-20

Today and next Sunday, our Gospel selection is taken from the third of Jesus' five great sermons in Matthew, from the Sermon on the Church. This sermon tells of the relationships which should characterize members of the Church.

Today, the Lord tells us that we must be humble enough to offer fraternal correction privately. It is easy to gossip about another person's faults. But Christians are called to *do* something about them.

We must recognize our own frailty and failures, while at the same time pointing out another person's faults *privately*. If this does not work, then we take another person with us, but still we keep it private. If this fails, we submit the problem to the community of faith.

The reading concludes with the spiritual power of the community: Whatever it binds is bound. Whenever the community unites in prayer, the Lord will grant it. Wherever two or three are gathered in his name, he is with them.

The other two readings complement the Gospel. We are called to share in the prophetic ministry: this means that we must not keep silence, but must *prudently* warn others of sin. All this must be done in charity.

The second reading tells us that our only debt to each other must be the debt of loving. We must love our neighbor as ourselves.

Dear Parishioners,

As we celebrate this second weekend in the month of September, the Church celebrates the 23rd Sunday in Ordinary time. In our readings for this weekend, the Scriptures confront a responsibility that we have, namely, the care and concern for others. We are not an island unto ourselves but, since we live in a community, we have a responsibility to care for each other. This role sometimes makes us feel very uncomfortable especially when other members of the community are making some poor decisions. According to our Scriptures this weekend, we are called to point out these poor choices so that those who are making them can change their ways. Isn't that what parents do, or at least, should do in correcting their children? But what happens when adults make those poor decisions? Without coming across as a do-gooder, or someone who thinks that he/she is better than others, and without any arrogance, we are called to help people change their ways. It's sure not easy nor are we comfortable doing it. But Jesus challenges us to this role so as to bring others back to their life of faith. This leaves us all very uncomfortable for it would be easier just to ignore or leave well enough alone. But since we live in a community, Jesus challenges us to help people see the wrong that is happening and somehow come back to the community that is central to their lives. And if we have tried, and tried again, then we promise them that we will continue to pray for them each day and endeavor to be models of faith for them.


After much prayer, I did write the bishop to get his permission to enter the next step in our capital improvement. Each of these steps need his permission and attention so that our I's are dotted and our T's are crossed. That next step was to engage the Steier Group to help us in our fundraising as well to hire an architect to do some conceptual drawings of our future project. With all transparency, this is what I wrote:

"Our feasibility study concluded that we could raise from \$5.9-\$6.9 million dollars. The Steier Group usually has a 90% success factor. Based on their projection, we eliminated any thought of the gym. But we would like to use the funds for a new cafeteria which would then allow us to use our current cafeteria as the new parish center. With the architects assistance, we also would like to plan for the future by looking at the prospect of some classrooms above the cafeteria. As of now, the estimated cost is running \$525 a square foot. Not sure of the latter project but we do have almost three million dollars invested in the diocesan savings and loan, of which we would like to use at least two million if necessary. And so I am writing to you requesting your permission to enter the next sate of our capital improvement."

I will let you know when I receive the permission. Please continue to pray for all of us as we continue this project for the betterment of our parish family.

People have been asking for the results of the parish picnic. Our temporary figures seem to indicate that the Saturday experience, because of the rain, was less than successful as far as finances are concerned. However, in terms of working together and having fun even in the rain, it was a success. Thank you!

As you will hopefully read in a bulletin article, we will begin again our Liturgy of the Word for children next Sunday, September 17 during the 9:30 a.m. Mass. Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Sudan's vast Diocese of El Obeid covers an area nearly one-third larger than the state of Texas. In light of the need for clergy and religious sisters and brothers to minister to Catholics spread out across the large area, the diocese prioritized vocations to the priesthood and consecrated religious life at its 2019 annual pastoral conference. The diocese entered into a partnership with the Diocese of Tombura -Yambio in South Sudan so that students from El Obeid could join a preliminary course in Yambio leading into their first year of seminary studies. With assistance from the Solidarity Fund for the Church in Africa, the Diocese of El Obeid recruited 15 new seminarians and four young women who entered the novitiate with the Congregation of Precious Blood Sisters in Nairobi, Kenya. Despite the challenges posed by the COVID-19 lockdown in 2020, the seminary in Juba, South Sudan, reopened in 2021 with 35 seminarians from the Diocese of El Obeid. On August 15, 2021, one of the seminarian beneficiaries of the Solidarity Fund for the Church in Africa's grant to the diocese was ordained a deacon, and others will be able to continue their studies.

The Solidarity Fund for the Church in Africa has been making real differences in the lives of Catholics in Africa for more than 15 years through its support of seminary training, the formation of religious sisters and brothers, and other pastoral ministries that address the needs of the rapidly growing African Church. When you participate in the collection for the Solidarity Fund for the Church in Africa, you play a key role in forming today's seminarians to become the pastoral leaders of tomorrow.

The Church in Africa needs your help to ensure that it can educate and form seminarians to minister to the faithful as the Church continues to grow there.
