Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

SEPTEMBER 17, 2023

Sirach 27:30–28:7; Romans 14:7-9;
Matthew 18: 21-35

The Gospel selection is taken from “the Sermon on the Church.” How many times should you forgive an offense? In the time of Jesus, the Scribes argued about this. Most of them said that we might forgive a person three times; they said that only God could forgive four times and that was the most.

Peter, then, thinks that he is being big-hearted when he asks Jesus if they should forgive “seven” times. Jesus replies, “Not seven times; but seventy times seven times!” This was unheard of. But it gives us one of the basic roots of our faith; it tells us how our faith is different from all other religions of the world.

Our faith is based on forgiveness. God is infinitely merciful. He forgives the unforgivable. He constantly calls sinners to repentance. He reaches out to those who do not deserve forgiveness. *And he expects us to do the same!* No other religion in the world has such a belief in the merciful forgiveness of God.

The “huge amount” which is forgiven in the Gospel is actually a specific figure: “10,000 talents.” A talent was a measure of silver or gold; 10,000 talents would be worth about \$18,000,000.00! The “mere fraction” was also a specific figure: “100 Denarii.” This would be worth about \$15.00! The lesson, of course, is that God has forgiven us infinitely, and he expects us to be forgiving of others.

The first reading tells us that we must not hang on to our anger or it will consume us. We cannot be unforgiving of others and expect God to forgive us. A paraphrase of this is in this Lord’s Prayer, where we pray that we shall be forgiven only if God forgives us.

The second reading tells us that we are not our own. We belong to the Lord and are responsible to him. Let us reflect his forgiveness in our lives.

Well, we are half way through our month of September and after breaking a number of heat temps, the weather is finally cooling down. It is much more relaxing to sit watching some athletic events with some reasonable temperature to enjoy, whether as a player or as a spectator. As we progress, mother nature will begin to show her colors and we will all get a glimpse of the beauty of creation.

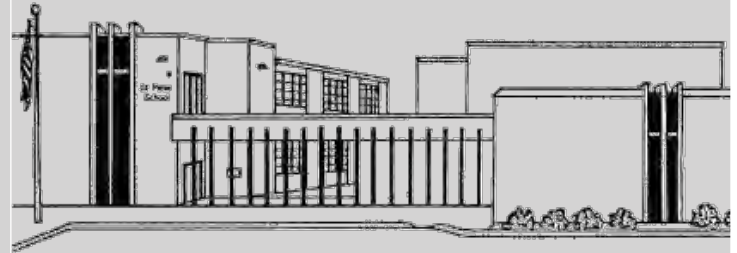
As we look ahead, the priests of our diocese are required to meet for their annual convocation of priests at the Double Tree Hotel in Collinsville, Illinois. The convocation begins this Monday, September 18 and lasts until Thursday, September 21. Since both priests will be away for this convocation, **THERE WILL BE NO MASSES FROM TUESDAY TO THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 19 -21. However, since one of our deacons has volunteered to do a communion service on those days, Deacon Bob will be having the liturgy of the Word and distributing of Holy Communion on those days for people who wish to come. Our next parish Mass will be on Friday, September 22 at 8:00 a.m.**

Also, as we look ahead, Bishop Thomas John will be in Quincy on Tuesday, September 26, to celebrate our All School's Mass at Quincy Notre Dame gym. All Catholic schools from the area, from Mt. Sterling to Hannibal, and all of Quincy, are invited to attend this opening of school Mass with our bishop. Any parishioner who would like to experience such a Mass is invited to attend and participate in this very moving liturgy. Needless to say, this Mass is what we are all about as Catholics and to celebrate it together reflects the very mission of our Church, evangelization and sacraments. Come and join us!

I am still waiting on the bishop for his approval of my letter asking for permission to hire the Steier Group to assist us in our fund-raising as well as hiring an architect to do some preliminary drawings. At this point in time, we are somewhat stuck until we get the necessary permissions to continue pursuing our capital improvement. In the meantime, I ask for your patience but most of all your continual enthusiasm for this major improvement in our parish. I am really excited to build this new cafeteria for our school because it will open up the old cafeteria under the parish to become our new parish center. This new parish center will be a place for our funeral dinners, as well as providing space for differing groups who desire to meet in some areas on our grounds. You don't have to be around our parish very long to realize that any free space is being utilized most days and most weekends. So keep praying as we make this dream come true.

Once again, I want to make sure you know that our diocese will be sponsoring what is called a Eucharistic congress. This is a time that we come together to appreciate and realize the role that the Eucharist plays in our lives as Catholics. And so, on Saturday, October 28, there will be only one Mass in our diocese and that will be in Springfield with the Bishop and all the priests concelebrating at the BOC in Springfield. Based on the October count, we were given 202 tickets of which 132 have already been spoken for. We still have 70 more and we ask you to call the rectory office to reserve them for you and your family. I really want to see all of these tickets used by our parishioners. Thank you!
