From the Pastor's Desk

Today the Church celebrates the **25th Sunday in** Ordinary Time. In the Gospel today, we hear the **Parable of the Workers in the Vineyard**. A landowner hires laborers to work his vineyard. He hires workers at different starting times throughout the day, ending with the last who work only an hour or two. At the end of the day, the landowner pays all the workers the same daily wage (one denarius). Those who worked the whole day grumble expecting a higher wage. Yet the landowner reminds them it is his money, of which he is being generous. The same is true of God's mercy. It is His Mercy, of which He is being generous. Salvation is not a matter of fairness, rather we are all supremely grateful for the infinite mercy of God.

This weekend we have our **Annual Coop Mission Appeal**. We welcome Fr. Joseph Reddy Duggempudi of the **Congregation of the Sisters of St. Anne**. Please share with Fr. Joseph our typical warm Blessed Sacrament hospitality. And please consider a generous contribution to his mission of the Sisters of St. Anne.

Next weekend (September 30-October 1) our parish Finance Council will present the **Annual Financial Report for Fiscal Year 2022-23.** Members of the Finance Council are making a brief presentation at each of our Sunday Masses. We thank the Finance Council for their good work in overseeing the financial operations of our parish.

Next weekend Blessed Sacrament will begin our October Count of all persons attending Mass on the weekends of October. These numbers assist the Springfield Diocese in their continued efforts of pastoral planning.

At our recent September Pastor's Cabinet meeting, we agreed that Blessed Sacrament Parish would take up the following monthly collections/donations:

1st Sunday of the Month: 2nd Collection for Haiti:

In an effort to further assist our Sister Parish of St. Antoine in Haiti, we will take up a 2nd Collection after Holy Communion for our Sister Parish. Monthly envelopes can be found in your Envelope packets.

2nd Sunday of the Month: St. Vincent De Paul Food Donations for Mini Food Pantry: In order to assist in filling our Mini Food Pantry across from the church on 7th Street, we ask parish members to bring non-perishable food donations on the 2nd Sunday of every month. (This will be distinct from the 4th Sunday food donations we receive for Catholic Charities/Ladies of Charity.) These food donations can be placed in the Gathering Space area. Our Vincent De Paul volunteers will store these non-perishable items, and disburse them into the pantry throughout each month.

Finally, please Save the date of **Sunday**, **October 8 at 6:00 p.m.** for our **Musical Concert with Donna Cori Gibson**. She is a Catholic vocal artist from St. Louis, and we are happy to have her with us in two weeks for the entire weekend. Please mark your calendars to attend!

Sing of Mary


Donna will share songs to praise our Savior, Jesus Christ, honoring and sharing stories & songs of our mother, Mary and ending with a sung rosary.





I took my walker so I could walk around the grounds & saw so many people that I hadn't seen for awhile. Well, time got away from me as I left my friends who were picked up on 8th Street, so I was walking alone toward my car in the dark going down 7th Street.

There was a group of young girls standing around the steps in front of the school & one of them came out to the street to me and said, "that outfit looks so nice on you," and then said "do you need any help?" Well, I was so surprised (I forgot that I am old & am showing my age) that I said "no thank you, but you just made my day."

Looking back on this event, I am sorry I didn't get her name. I would say she was probably a 7th or 8th grader at Blessed Sacrament. She would have walked me to my car & helped me put my walker in. She walked away from her friends to help an old woman! I am still so filled with this, I just can't get over it. I have shared it with 3 other people & it still warms my heart to tell the story.

Our children learn so much more than reading, writing, & arithmetic in the Catholic School! Is this the "service" that they learn or one work of mercy?
