

Growing Disciples Diocesan Discernment Update Priests throughout the diocese have been informed about the first round of proposals addressing alignment of parishes in our diocese. This past week, our lay leader/representatives had these same proposals presented to them. During the month of October, we will have meetings with participation from our parishioners to discuss this first round of proposals. Please keep in mind that these are initial proposals, and not final decisions. After the parish meetings in October, there will be yet another round of meetings with priests, lay representatives, and parishioners at large as we near a final decision in the late spring/early summer of 2024.


