Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

SEPTEMBER 24, 2023

Isaiah 55:6-9; Philippians 1:20c-24,27a; Matthew 20:1-16a

Remember that a parable is a riddle, a story with an intriguing or strange twist. Parables usually have something out-of-the-ordinary or unexpected. The conclusion of today's parable is very unexpected: Those who are hired late in the day get the same pay as those who worked all day long!

This is not a lesson on social justice; it is a lesson on God's gracious invitation to all people to be saved. God called the Hebrews (Israelites, Jews) to be his special people; he called them early. He called the Gentiles (non-Jews) last of all. But he offers all the reward of eternal life.

Very likely, Matthew wrote this parable in the context of his Church community in which there were many Jewish Christians. They were "first," so they thought that they should always have the place of honor and prestige – the important posts in the Church.

The parable reminds everyone that we are equal in God's eyes; God is generous to all; those who come last will enjoy the same joy as those who enter first; no one can claim a special place from God.

The first reading reminds us that God's ways are not like our ways. We operate on the profit motive and on merit. God operates out of his infinite lovingkindness and mercy. God is merciful to all.

Today we begin using Philippians as our first reading. This is a friendly letter written by Paul from his imprisonment at Ephesus around 58 A.D. He thanks the Philippians for sending him aid. He is not discouraged over his imprisonment; he says that it does not matter where he is – alive or dead – as long as he serves the Lord

Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time, September 24, 2023 Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate the 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time. In our gospel this weekend, Jesus tells a parable to help us better understand how generous and merciful God is. In this parable, a landowner is in need of laborers for the harvest. So he hires some in the morning hours, another group at noon, and still others at 3:00 and 5:00 respectively. When the time came for payment of wages, the ones hired last received the same salary as the ones hired first. Needless to say, there was much grumbling as those hired first thought that since they worked longer should have received a higher salary. The landowner replied that those hired first had agreed to the wage that was paid. And then he responded to their complaints, "I am not cheating you. Did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? Take what is yours and go. What if I wish to give the last one the same as you? Or am I not free to do as I wish with my own money? Are you envious because I am generous?" This last question seems to hit the nail on the head. God has created us in His image and likeness and each of us is loved by Him. And each of us responds to God's invitation in many differing ways. Some respond right away, others take a different turn, and still others often at the last minute. It doesn't matter when because the point of the parable is God is so very generous to each person of His creation. Our problem happens when you and I start comparing ourselves to others. And of course, we find ourselves often short-changed because that is our human nature. But God's grace is given generously to all of us. And we need to be ever thankful for that generosity. That's the point of our parable. So the advice is stop comparing, and stop complaining—be thankful that our God is so generous to all of us.

This Tuesday, September 26, we will be having our annual all Catholic schools Mass at the QND pit at 9:30 a.m. The Bishop will be here to celebrate this Mass along with the priests and deacons of the area. The Catholic schools of the Quincy deanery will be present. This Mass is a beautiful reflection of who we are as Catholic schools. We might be from the Quincy area but our Church to which we belong is the diocese of Springfield in Illinois under the guidance and leadership of our bishop. All parishioners are invited to attend and celebrate with us.

If you wish to have some tickets to this important gathering, please consult the bulletin about how to order them. We had to turn in our final numbers but the diocese now will be making the reservations for you. So check out this bulletin for further details.


