Isaiah 25:6-10a; Philippians 4:12-14,19-20; Matthew 22:1-14

In the Bible, heaven is often described as a great banquet, a feast in which there is plenty of food and drink for everyone. Although Isaiah knew little about heaven, he thought of paradise in these terms.

He looked forward to a time when all people would be united in peace, when there would be no death or suffering, and when everyone would have plenty of food and drink. This is what we call the "Messianic Hope." Jewish tradition thought that this hope would be fulfilled when the Messiah came.

Jesus uses a banquet parable to describe salvation or heaven. The parable was told against the Pharisees. They thought that the only ones to be saved were righteous Jews who kept all 613 precepts of the Law of Moses.

In the parable, these are the ones who refuse the invitation of the king. The king invites them again and again. This refers to the prophets whom the Lord sent. But they ignored his invitation and abused his messengers.

The king then invites all others to the banquet. This refers to the Gentiles, to us, to those who are not God's first choice. It is a teaching of our Catholic faith that God invites everyone to salvation, and that he gives sufficient grace to everyone to be saved.

The longer form of the Gospel adds a corollary to this, however. Everyone is expected to change his life. The parable says that someone was not properly dressed. He was willing to accept the invitation, but not willing to change his ways. He was cast outside.

God in his lovingkindness has invited us to salvation. But we must respond to his invitation by conversion of heart. Those who refuse will be outside with those who ignored the invitation in the first place.

In the second reading, Paul tells us that we should learn how to cope amid all circumstances of life. Somehow, God will see us through. He will supply our needs. He is the source of our strength.

28TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

This weekend's readings we are summoned to the wedding feast of the Son of the Father. This wedding feast of the lamb is about the mass. Many are invited, few show, and even fewer who show are actually ready and prepared. We must make sure that we live our lives free of sin and run to confession when we sin to be prepared to receive the Eucharist. So many think they do not need this sacrament of confession. It is a powerful experience of God's love and mercy. Brothers and sisters in all aspects of our faith, everything is supposed to be medicinal even when it means saying no, not yet, or you must change first. In the wedding feast of the lamb, if we have not taken the invitation by the Father seriously, when we show up to the eternal feast in heaven, we will be met with being cast out of the feast, eternally. We must remind ourselves then to live our lives in a manner of love, mercy, forgiveness, compassion, and all the Gospel values. Never should we be a people of hatred, foul language, threats, etc. no matter the cause. Even in righteous anger it is to speak words of truth, not hatred. So may we always seek to live as if we are preparing for the eternal wedding feast of the Lamb, Jesus Christ. Isaiah tells us of the glory of this feast! May we look to our God who has saved us! May we accept His gift of Salvation and feast eternally with Him.

We must pray for this awful situation in Israel. The horrific murder of so many innocent lives is just gut wrenching. We must pray for all people involved, but for Hamas terror organization to stop this evil and to stop the evil of using their women and children as shields of protection. Pray for Peace. Pray for conversions of hearts.

Next weekend at the 4:30 mass, Kenrick Seminary Propaedeutic program is coming to visit St. Francis and Fr. Tolton. YES, Thomas Marten will be here visiting with them! There should be 12-15 seminarians with him and Fr. Auro, their formation director. Propaedeutic is a term which means prestudies or an introduction to further study. This is a new conception in formation throughout the USA that allows men to learn to detach from the stuff of life and learn to embrace and experience the spiritual life and most especially the life of prayer. We are so excited to host them all next weekend. If you are not a 4:30 mass attendee, maybe try it out to come welcome this wonderful group studying for the priesthood throughout the nation.

There will be an hour of Adoration for Priests on Sunday, October 15 from 3-4 p.m. at St. Francis. All are welcome to come and pray for our priests.


Holy Name News
