Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary 7ime

OCTOBER 15, 2023

Isaiah 25:6-10a; Philippians 4:12-14,19-20; Matthew 22:1-14

In the Bible, heaven is often described as a great banquet, a feast in which there is plenty of food and drink for everyone. Although Isaiah knew little about heaven, he thought of paradise in these terms.

He looked forward to a time when all people would be united in peace, when there would be no death or suffering, and when everyone would have plenty of food and drink. This is what we call the "Messianic Hope." Jewish tradition thought that this hope would be fulfilled when the Messiah came.

Jesus uses a banquet parable to describe salvation or heaven. The parable was told against the Pharisees. They thought that the only ones to be saved were righteous Jews who kept all 613 precepts of the Law of Moses.

In the parable, these are the ones who refuse the invitation of the king. The king invites them again and again. This refers to the prophets whom the Lord sent. But they ignored his invitation and abused his messengers.

The king then invites all others to the banquet. This refers to the Gentiles, to us, to those who are not God's first choice. It is a teaching of our Catholic faith that God invites everyone to salvation, and that he gives sufficient grace to everyone to be saved.

The longer form of the Gospel adds a corollary to this, however. Everyone is expected to change his life. The parable says that someone was not properly dressed. He was willing to accept the invitation, but not willing to change his ways. He was cast outside.

God in his lovingkindness has invited us to salvation. But we must respond to his invitation by conversion of heart. Those who refuse will be outside with those who ignored the invitation in the first place.

In the second reading, Paul tells us that we should learn how to cope amid all circumstances of life. Somehow, God will see us through. He will supply our needs. He is the source of our strength.

Dear Parishioners,


With our bulletin this week, we are half way through our month of October. What seemingly was a rather slow September, has really picked up these past several weeks. The weather is finally "fall like" and hopefully we will be experiencing a change in mother nature. This can be a most beautiful time of the year but I fear with our lack of rain, nature will not be as striking in beauty as it normally is. Whatever the case, we will take whatever God shares with us.

In our readings today, both the prophet Isaiah as well as the parable of Jesus speak of a feast to which all people are invited. Isaiah speaks about the "Lord providing for all peoples, a feast of rich food and choice wines." This feast would have been the fulfillment of the hopes of so many Israelites, a desire to be with God when even death would be destroyed. Perhaps this was the vision of heaven for many of the chosen people especially since life was so much a struggle for them. With their hopes and dreams fulfilled in this lasting meal, the Israelites could rejoice that the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, had truly saved them and there was no longer anything to fear for the Lord would provide for them. This concept of the Lord providing underlies what living the life of a steward is all about. When we trust that the Lord would provide, you and I then can return to this providential God a portion of our time, talents, and treasures. Then we find in our gospel, the parable of a king who gave a wedding feast for his son. Needless to say, the king is our God. Invited guests (the elders and leaders of Israel) are invited but they refused. After several attempts, we even find that these invited guests mistreated and even killed the messengers (prophets). This whole parable is a summary of Biblical history of the Old Testament. And then the king opens up the invitations to other guests (sinners and tax collectors). Finally, the hall was filled with guests. And Jesus concludes that "many are invited but few are chosen." You and I are the invited guests to the banquet of our God, namely, this Eucharist that we celebrate each and every day. Hopefully, we respond with our RSVP's to God's invitation to be a part of His banquet which is a foretaste of our vision of heaven. May each of us respond with a willingness of heart and soul as this banquet prepares us for the banquet of heaven.

I want to welcome the students of QND along with their dates and families to this Mass before their homecoming dance. This Eucharist is truly the banquet of the Lord and if we ever desire to have our homecoming with our Lord in heaven we begin by celebrating this banquet here on earth. I pray that God will keep you safe from all harm and that you enjoy your evening and make wise decisions.

Just a reminder that ON SATURDAY, OCTOBER 28, THERE WILL BE NO MASSES ON THAT DAY. WE WILL BE IN SPRINGFIELD CELEBRATING THE EUCHARISTIC CONGRESS WITH THE REST OF THE DIOCESE. So let me repeat, there will be no 8:00 a.m. nor 5:00 p.m. on Saturday, October 28. Since there will be no Masses on that Saturday, we will not be having confessions on Saturday morning nor on Saturday afternoon. Through this Eucharistic renewal we all will appreciate this Sacrament of the Eucharist even more and make sure that it is central to our lives.
