

Gittings Mound Cemetery Sunset Service In Honor of the Faithful Departed. Thanks to the generous assistance of the members of our developing Youth Group, we are pleased to announce that on Sunday, November 5, at 4:00 p.m., our Youth Group will host and lead a candlelight prayer service for the faithful departed at Gittings Mound Cemetery, outside of Dallas City and La Harpe. This was the site of one of the earliest founded Catholic Churches in our county. Members of every church, and of our school, are invited to attend. It will be a beautiful setting of remembrance for our loved ones who are now in the realm of eternal life. The prayer observance will be no longer than 20 minutes, and for our Youth Group, a cookout will follow. To make sure that we're all on our way home safely, we'll be wrapping things up a bit before 5:30 p.m. So, if you're coming, bring a candle - please make sure it's enclosed in glass or plastic - and if you want to bring along your own hot dogs, marshmallows, chips, sticks...whatever!...and stay awhile yourselves, please do! World Mission Sunday. "Hearts on Fire, Feet on the Move." As Christians we are called to kindle the fire of Christ's love in our hearts.
