Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

OCTOBER 29, 2023 Exodus 22:20-26; 1 Thessalonians 1:5c-10; Matthew 22: 34-40

At the time of Jesus, Pharisees held that the ultimate self-revelation of God was the Torah. The Torah was eternal, unchangeable, and the way of salvation. If a person kept the Torah, he would find life.

They distinguished 613 precepts or laws in the Torah. Although the Torah was eternal, it was revealed to Moses in time, on Mt. Sinai. But the elders held that not all precepts were equal; some were "heavy" and some were "light." So they asked Jesus what was the most important precept in the Torah.

Jesus quoted Deuteronomy 6:5 (Love God above all). And then he added Leviticus 19:18 as a co-equal precept (Love your neighbor as yourself). Jesus was the first person to put these two laws together and make them different sides of the same coin.

The first reading in its details is irrelevant to modern life. But it instructs us that our love of neighbor must be practical and concrete.

Too many people talk a good game of "care and compassion," but never *do* anything. If we say we love our neighbor, we must show it by our deeds.

In the second reading, Paul uses good psychology in complimenting the Thessalonians on their faith and constancy. If we want to win people to our viewpoint, we do not mount a frontal attack or verbal broadside. Honey attracts more flies than vinegar.

Dear Parishioners,


We gather this weekend to celebrate the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time. Those of you who pay attention to our liturgical year will realize that there are only 34 Sundays in this particular liturgical year with the last Sunday, the 34th, being the Solemnity of Christ the King. Then, we begin a new liturgical year with the celebration of Advent. I'm not quite ready to begin this four week period that prepares us for Christmas but the way our year is going, it will soon be with us. So I just want to prepare you for the coming events that will be here in no time.

This past Saturday, October 28, our diocese celebrated what is called a Eucharistic Congress. Basically this means that we have designated this day to grow in our appreciation and understanding as a diocese of this great Sacrament that our Lord Jesus has left us. For many of us, this Sacrament that we celebrate each and every weekend, is so often taken for granted and the full meaning of it is sometimes lost in our routines each weekend. Just the names of the Eucharist through the years should help us understand that what we do each weekend, and in fact, each day, is a celebration if something most important in our lives as Catholics. Here are some names of the Eucharist: The Lord's Supper; The breaking of the bread; The Eucharistic assembly; The memorial of the Lord's Passion and Resurrection; The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass; The Holy and Divine Liturgy; The celebration of the Sacred Mysteries; The Blessed Sacrament; Holy Communion; and finally, The Mass. Whatever term we use, this Sacrament of the Eucharist identifies us as to who we are and what we are called to be. As we renew ourselves this weekend with a greater appreciation of the Eucharist, let's always be conscious of this great gift from God, celebrate it as the most important thing we will do, and be strengthened by it to go forth and be what we have consumed, namely, Jesus Christ for others.

As a review, when we receive Holy Communion, we are receiving the Real Presence of Jesus in both the bread and the wine. As Catholics, this means that when we come forward, we hear the Eucharistic minister say, "The Body of Christ," or if we receive from the cup, we hear the Eucharistic minister say, "The Blood of Christ." And our response is the affirmation "YES," in other words, "I believe." What we receive is not a symbol of Christ, but truly His Real Presence, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity. I hope and pray that we grow in our understanding of this great mystery and are among those who celebrate it each week and live it each day. Jesus tells us in St. John's Gospel, "Truly I say to you, unless you eat the Flesh of the Son of man and drink His Blood, you have no life in you." Sad part is that many walked away from Jesus—then Jesus turns to His disciples and to each of us and asks, "Are you too going to walk away?"

Next weekend is Commitment Sunday. We will hear from two parishioners who will share what stewardship has meant to them. In response, I invite you to think about how you are involved at St. Peter's. The commitment card that you received in the mail offers suggestions for how you can take a step forward in each of the different areas. This Wednesday, we begin the new month of November. During this month, the Church invites us to remember the dead, those deceased in our families and in our parish. As a reminder of those who were buried from St. Peter, we will have the Book of the Dead in front of our Easter candle at all of our Masses. This is just a reminder to pray for those who have gone before us. The month of November we make front and center that profession of faith in the apostles creed that states that "we believe in the Communion of Saints." The first part of this profession is celebrated on Wednesday, November 1 with the Solemnity of All Saints. This day we remember those who have completed their life journeys and are now resting in the arms of God. As a reminder, we will have various statues on the side altar of the Blessed Mother. Since All Saints is a Holvday of Obligation for Catholics our Mass schedule is as follows: October 31, 5:30 Mass (vigil)

November 1, 8:30 a.m., 10:00 a.m. (QND), 12:10 p.m., and 6:30 p.m.

Then on Thursday, November 2, we celebrate the Commemoration of all the faithful departed, often called All Soul's Day. This too is proclaimed in the Communion of Saints as we remember those in purgation, those souls who have completed their life's journey and with God's mercy prepare themselves for the eternal happiness of heaven. This doctrine is a sign of God's continual mercy as even after death He is making us ready for our eternal home. "May the souls of all the faithful departed rest in peace." Amen!
