- CHAPLAIN'S REFLECTION...

Dear Brother Knights & Family Members,

As the end of the Church year fast approaches, the Scriptures remind us of the Final Judgment at the end of time. Have you ever thought about that moment when you will be summoned before awesome presence of the Lord?



May God have mercy on us that day!

The thought of that can be very unsettling, for, if we are honest with ourselves, we remember that we have failed countless times. Perhaps we have fooled others, and indeed some have even fooled themselves—but before the unblinking eyes of the Lord, who can stand?

Would you want to get a preview of what that final judgment will be like for you???

One of the saints offered us an insight into that moment: St. John Climacus observed: "For him who truly prays, prayer is the court, the judgment hall and the tribunal of the Lord before the judgment to come."

Wait! Stop and reflect on that!

Prayer puts us in the very presence of the living God, a time when the light of his majestic gaze falls upon us. And that look of justice and truth, mercy and love judges or measure. And he speaks to us.

Shall I make it to heaven?

Well, what is my prayer life like?

God made us for "heaven," for eternal life. To get to "heaven" is not the product of a lottery, of buying enough good deeds to increase our chances of getting the jackpot.


Rather, getting into heaven begins here, the result of *getting to know Jesus* in prayer. As Jesus himself taught; "Now this is eternal life: that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent." (John 17:3, NIV)";

And prayer blossoms into service. Mother Teresa said it so well:

We wait impatiently for the paradise where God is, but we have it in our power to be in paradise with Him, right now. Being happy with Him means: To love as he loves; To help as he helps; to give as he gives; to serve as he serves.

Heaven is much more like a state of being, of relationship — rather than being a location "up above."

Our thinking is locked into human material images rather than the spiritual truths taught by Jesus. I do not deny that heaven can be a place, but rather point out that the door of heaven starts in each of our hearts, united with His.



As St. Paul observed, "Eye hath not seen, nor ear heard. nor has it entered into the heart of man, the things that God hath prepared for them that love him." (1 Corinthians 2:9)
