

Part II: The Moral Vision of Jesus Christ in His Body, the Catholic Church, in the Face of Contemporary Trends in Sexual Morality.

Thank you for your patience and your willingness to follow along with the sermons between August and this past weekend in November. Their purpose was to explain the foundation for living the Life of Christ in our lives. Now it's time to apply the foundation we presented, step by step, and demonstrate the what, how and why, of the teaching of Christ as set forth by the Catholic Church. We don't rashly judge the current condition of our Church: if the Body of Christ on earth is split down the middle on the major moral issues of the day, then chances are that the Body of Christ, present in the Catholic Churches of Hancock County, reflects that split. All the more reason to understand the what, how and why of our sacred teaching. Immediately below are the next two sermon topics that serve as an introduction to this second installment of sermons: Conscience and Consciousness. There will be two additional sermons addressing: how to listen to a priest in personal settings and in the public setting of the pulpit; and how to be with family members whose lives do not reflect the teaching of the Catholic faith. And then....well, you'll see the topics, soon enough. Fr. T.
