



**Masses for Thanksgiving Day:** We can't do *everything* we used to do in years gone by, for Thanksgiving Day Masses. But for this year at least, we can schedule a Mass at both Sts. Peter and Paul Church in Nauvoo, and Immaculate Conception Church in Carthage. Here's the Mass schedule on the morning of Thanksgiving Day: **9 a.m. at SPPN, and 10 a.m. at ICC. There will not be a Mass on the Friday after Thanksgiving.**

**On Thanksgiving Day:** The proclamations of both President Washington and President Lincoln on the establishment of a national day of Thanksgiving are worth reading: along with the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution of the United States, they reflect the vision of a just society, the admission of how far we fall from that vision, and the mechanism by which we forgive, purify, and correct the sins of the nation in every generation. It's all there: no need to tear anything down, or reinvent the wheel. On this Thanksgiving, let's pray that we don't need a world war again, to jolt our citizenry into an awareness of what it means to mature and value what really matters. Have you ever tried composing your own litany of Thanksgiving? Say you're travelling to be with family: you get in a vehicle that a labor force built; they were employees of a company; your vehicles needed roads; the roads need construction and upkeep; that means materials; here come factories and various businesses; employees; salaries; the ability to provide food, clothing, and shelter; leading to friendship and family gathering together; there's the use of time; and so on. Lots to be thankful for, even if you're the poorest of the poor - you can really surprise yourself with your litany of thanksgiving. This keyboard, this computer, copy machine right behind me, people I work with who use the same resources, how invaluable they are to me, how they are to their families, how their families are to our churches and our school...better stop for now. This Thanksgiving thing can go overboard, like right away! Fr. T.
