

The Solemnity of Christ the King. Just in case somebody "out there" doesn't know: in Catholic faith, New Year's Day isn't January 1. It's next Sunday, the First Sunday of Advent. While we recognize the beginning of the civil new year of January 1 with the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God, as far as the worship of Jesus Christ in our church is concerned, the calendar starts with the First Sunday of Advent. But there's something that's celebrated beforehand: and that's Jesus Christ as our Sovereign King, this weekend. Have you ever asked yourself whom or what we worship? I mean, really worship? Worship and adoration means that there's someone or something that is so totally "other" than anything or anyone else around, that you: stop to acknowledge it/Him at a sacred place apart from your usual pattern of life: give yourself over to imitating it/Him wherever you are, in everything you do, no matter who's watching: and base the conduct of your days on this earth on whatever claim it/He has on your entire life, no matter what it costs you.

Let's drop the "it/Him" part; we're talking about Jesus Christ. Is He sovereign? Does your time, activity, use of language, and forgiveness of others reflect His Kingly rule? And *this* King foregoes the privileges of being King, empties Himself to enter into our humanity, makes His life a sacrifice on the Cross, and gives us the gift of consuming His sacrifice, now and forever Risen. He asks of us imitation to the point of identity, so that His Kingdom can be more fully known. "To Jesus Christ, Our Sovereign King, who is the world's salvation: all praise and homage do we bring thanks and adoration." What - *Whom* - do we worship?
