

From the Pastor's Desk

Today the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. This is the last Sunday of both Ordinary Time and our Liturgical year. Next Sunday we celebrate the First Sunday of Advent and the start of a new Liturgical year.

Our readings today remind us that the Lord is our Shepherd and at the end, at His coming, He will hand over the Kingdom to His Father. He will "judge between one sheep and another, between rams and goats," between those who have lived for others and those who have lived for themselves.

This is a significant celebration for us. Though already present in His Church,

Christ's reign is nevertheless yet to be fulfilled "with power and great glory" by the King's return to earth. This reign is still under attack by the evil powers, even though they have been defeated definitively by Christ's Passover. Until everything is subject to Him, until there be realized new heavens and a new earth in which justice dwells, the pilgrim Church, in Her Sacraments and institutions, which belong to this present age, carries the mark of this world which will pass, and She herself takes Her place among the creatures which groan and travail yet and await the revelation of the sons of God. That is why Christians pray, above all in the Eucharist, to hasten Christ's return by saying to Him: Our Lord, come!

The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, formerly referred to as "Christ the King," was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925 as an antidote to secularism, a way of life which leaves God out of man's thinking and living and organizes his life as if God did not exist. The feast is intended to proclaim in a striking and effective manner Christ's royalty over individuals, families, society, governments, and nations.

Today's Mass establishes the titles for Christ's royalty over men: 1) Christ is God, the Creator of the universe and hence wields a supreme power over all things; "All things were created by Him"; 2) Christ is our Redeemer, He purchased us by His precious Blood, and made us His property and possession; 3) Christ is Head of the Church, "holding in all things the primacy"; 4) God bestowed upon Christ the nations of the world as His special possession and dominion.

Today's Mass also describes the qualities of Christ's Kingdom. This kingdom is: 1) supreme, extending not only to all people but also to their princes and kings; 2) universal, extending to all nations and to all places; 3) eternal, for "The Lord shall sit as King forever"; 4) spiritual, Christ's "Kingdom is not of this world." -LITURGICAL CELEBRATION THIS WEEK:

-Thursday, November 30 - Feast of St. Andrew, Apostle. Andrew was the brother of Simon Peter and disciple of John

the Baptist. Tradition holds that he preached north of the Black Sea and in Greece and died bound to an X-shaped cross at Petra, Greece in the First Century. He is mentioned in the Roman Canon (Eucharistic Prayer I) and is the patron of Russia, Scotland, and the fishing industry. St. Andrew, Pray for us!

-ANDREW DINNER – As I've mentioned in past bulletins, the next Andrew Dinner for our Deanery will be Monday, November 27 at St. Anthony Parish in Quincy (2223 St. Anthony Road). It will begin at 5:30 p.m. with Evening Prayer and should conclude around 8:00 p.m. This is an informal gathering for men high school age and older who may be considering the priesthood or may want to simply learn more about a vocation to the priesthood. Bishop Paprocki and clergy of the Deanery will be present. I cannot stress enough that this commits no one to anything. I am planning to be there. If you are a single man interested in going, I would be very happy to have you as my guest. Since the dinner is now upon us, please let me know immediately if you'd like to go and I will make the arrangements.

I ask you all to continue your prayers for good and holy vocations to the Priesthood, Permanent Diaconate, Religious Life, Married Life, and Single Life. Please pray also for those in formation and those preparing for marriage as well as all of our Bishops, Priests, Deacons, Religious Brothers, Religious Sisters, and married couples.

-“MEMORIAL” MASS – A reminder that this Thursday, November 30, as we close out the month of November, Mass will be celebrated as usual at St. Thomas at 5:30 p.m. (Exposition and Adoration from 4:15 – 5:15). At this Mass, there will be a table in the Sanctuary where pictures of those who have died will be arranged and we will pray for those folks in a particular way at that Mass. If you'd like to include a picture of someone who has died, you can bring it to Church any time before then...I will try to have a designated place in the “coat room” off of the vestibule for you to leave the pictures. It would be nice to include a note with the picture(s) with the name of the person(s) but not necessary. Then, I hope you can join us

for this Mass as we pray for the faithful departed in a particular way.

-PRAYER TO OBTAIN FAVORS - It is piously believed that whoever recites the following prayer fifteen times a day from the feast of St. Andrew (November 30) until Christmas will obtain what is asked. This prayer carries an Imprimatur, +MICHAEL AUGUSTINE, Archbishop of New York, New York, February 6, 1897. Like any prayer, it is not magic or anything of the like but is to be prayed with great piety, devotion, faith, and hope.

The Prayer is sometimes referred to as the St. Andrew Christmas Novena mostly because of its start date of November 30, the Feast of St. Andrew, and its end date being Christmas Eve. Most often, Novenas are prayed for nine days with few exceptions. This particular prayer is one such exception. I would encourage you to consider embarking on piously and devoutly praying this prayer/novena as intended, again, fifteen times each day throughout the day beginning on November 30 and ending on Christmas Eve. The following is the prayer:

“Hail and blessed be the hour and moment in which the Son of God was born of the most pure Virgin Mary, at midnight, in Bethlehem, in the piercing cold. In that hour, vouchsafe, I beseech Thee, O my God! to hear my prayer and grant my desires, through the merits of Our Savior Jesus Christ, and of His Blessed Mother. Amen.”

-POPE'S INTENTION – the Holy Father's intention for December is for persons with disabilities.

-FIRST FRIDAY – Friday, December 1 is First Friday and so we will have our First Friday Devotion at St. Thomas with Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament beginning at Noon and going until 5:45 p.m. Benediction will be at 5:45 p.m. followed by Mass at 6:00 p.m. The Sacrament of Reconciliation will be available from 5:00 p.m. – 5:45 p.m. As always, I encourage all of us to spend some time in prayer in front of the Blessed Sacrament and to enter into the Sacrament of Reconciliation. What a wonderful opportunity for all of us.

-NOCTURNAL ADORATION – Nocturnal Adoration at Holy Family will begin on

Saturday evening, December 2 at 10:00 p.m. It will go overnight as usual and end with benediction at 7:45 a.m. on Sunday morning followed by the regularly scheduled 8:00 a.m. Mass. Again, I encourage everyone to come and spend some time in prayer in front of the Blessed Sacrament.

-DONUT SUNDAY – Next Sunday, December 3, is the first Sunday of the month which is “Donut Sunday” for St. Thomas. Plan to join us in the hall after Mass.

-DEACON MIKE – Deacon Mike has wrapped up his service at our parishes. I want to thank him again for his work in the parishes and his great care and dedication. Please continue to keep him and Jean and their family in your prayers.

-IMMACULATE CONCEPTION – As noted above, next Friday, December 8 is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This is a Holy Day of Obligation. The faithful are obliged (required) to participate in the celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass on this day (or at a Vigil the night before in anticipation of the day). It is seriously sinful to completely disregard this obligation. There are a number of Masses scheduled at both parishes which should give everyone ample opportunity to carry out this obligation. Mass times for each parish are listed previously.

-CHRISTMAS – A note concerning Christmas and the Fourth Sunday of Advent this year. As Catholics, we are obliged (required) to participate in the celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass EVERY Sunday and EVERY Holy Day of Obligation. Not to do so is seriously sinful and puts the salvation of one’s soul in serious danger. To brush this obligation off as no big deal is quite serious. If one does not participate in the celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass as obliged to do so and without legitimate reason, Sacramental Reconciliation is NECESSARY BEFORE receiving Holy Communion otherwise one commits the sin of sacrilege, also a very serious sin.

I might clarify that there are indeed legitimate reasons that one might not be able to participate in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass including illness or actual inability to get to Mass. For most people, these will certainly be the exception and not the rule. Even then, the faithful should attempt to view Mass on TV, read the readings for the day, make a Spiritual Communion, and offer additional prayer. Inconvenient Mass times, ball games, family get-togethers, being tired, and even work or travel ARE almost NEVER legitimate reasons for not fulfilling one’s obligation to participate in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. If a particular difficulty arises, one should speak directly with his or her pastor.

Concerning obligation, we do refer to such participation as an obligation since it is an obligation, but the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is the greatest and most life-giving gift that God has ever given to us. We should desire our participation in it and should take every opportunity we have to participate in it, even on weekdays. I encourage each of you to consider the great gift we have in the Mass, where we receive the fullness of Jesus Christ Himself - Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity in the Holy Eucharist. There is no greater gift! May we all come to see the great opportunity we have to participate in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass...if we can do that, it no longer even seems like an obligation.

Having said that, with Christmas falling on Monday this year, we must understand and be clear that we have an obligation to participate in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass for the Fourth Sunday of Advent AND an obligation to participate in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass for Christmas. Though Christmas Eve Masses will be celebrated on Sunday evening, they will not fulfill your Sunday obligation. The Christmas Eve Masses celebrated on Sunday evening will fulfill your Christmas obligation. Your Sunday obligation is fulfilled either at the Vigil Mass on Saturday evening or Mass on Sunday morning. So yes, you do have to go to Mass TWICE if that is how you want to say it, although a sad way to say it. We have an obligation to celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Advent and an obligation to celebrate the Solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord (Christmas) this year as we do every year. If you have questions, do not hesitate to ask me.

-CHRISTMAS CARDS - I am again making available to you some beautiful and solidly Catholic Christmas cards. They have arrived and are available in the back of church at both parishes while they last. There are also envelopes available once again marked Christmas Cards for you to make a contribution toward the cards if you'd like...you can drop that in the collection basket or give it to me.

Once again, I am personally making these available to you myself. There is no cost to the parishes. Any contributions beyond the

cost of the cards will go to the parishes. Likewise, costs not covered by contributions will be covered by me. I want folks to use these if they desire so, please do. If you cannot make a contribution at this time, that is fine. Do not let that stop you from using the cards.

I am happy to make these available since they are solidly Catholic and beautiful cards, and it is so important that we remember what Christmas is and what it celebrates and that we share that with others. Sending cards and notes is also a great way to reach out to folks. I also urge you to use the Religious stamps from the Post Office when sending your cards and other mail. Those tend to sell out early, so I urge you to get them as soon as they are available.

-CHRISTMAS FLOWER DONATIONS - As in the past, if you would like to make a contribution toward our Christmas flowers, I invite you to do so. St. Thomas Parishioners should have an envelope for Christmas Flowers in their regular set of offertory envelopes. If not, simply place your contribution in an envelope marked "Christmas Flowers. At Holy Family, please place contributions in an envelope and mark clearly on the outside "Christmas Flowers."

The contributions can be placed in the regular Sunday collection or mailed into the parish office. These contributions are often made in memory of someone. If you are making such a contribution, please include the name(s) of the person(s) with your contribution, if you would like, so that I may offer prayers for them.

Thank you for your continued prayers for me, one another, our parishes and school, and the Universal Church. Please be assured of my prayers for you each day. May you have a most blessed week.
