Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King

NOVEMBER 26, 2023

Ezekiel 34:11-12,15-17;

1 Corinthians 15:20-26,28; Matthew 25:31-46

What difference does Jesus Christ make in your life? When you are at work or at play, does your faith in him make you any different from others? When you are relaxing with friends, or when you are enjoying recreation, are you any different because you know Christ Jesus?

Jesus Christ should be the meaning of every dimension of our lives. If we truly live for Christ, we don't need to parade it or to always talk "God-speak." People will know we are Christians by the way we live. They will see in our lives the reflection of Jesus Christ. Our deeds will speak louder than our words.

The Feast of Christ the King was instituted in 1925 (in the "Roaring Twenties") when civic and social life was divorced entirely from religion. It was the time of the rise of Totalitarian dictatorships. Among religious people, it was a time of sentimentality without substance.

We claim Christ as our King: All laws of nations must be subject to his moral reign. We claim Christ as our King: We cannot be content with mere sentimentality in our private religion; we are called to profess our faith publicly and boldly.

Our first reading is from Ezekiel. The metaphor of "shepherd" was used for the leaders of Israel, both secular and religious. Unfortunately, during Ezekiel's time, those leaders were corrupt. The Lord says that he himself will become our shepherd, our leader. He will rescue the scattered and lost sheep; he will protect all the sheep of his flock.

The fifteenth chapter of First Corinthians is a great sermon on the resurrection. Death is the great enemy, the great fear, of all people. But not for the Christian! Christ has risen from the dead. He is the "first fruits" or the cause of our own resurrection. Because he has risen, we, too, shall rise; death cannot hold us.

What, then do we ever have to fear? At the end of the world, all peoples will appear before the Lord. He will judge them on the basis of what they have done – or failed to do – to others. We shall be very surprised to hear that whatever we did – or failed to do – to our neighbor in need, we did (or failed to do) to Christ himself. Let us strive to see the image of Christ in every person. In this way we shall truly proclaim that he is king over our lives.

Dear Parishioners,

This is our last weekend in our month of November and on this last weekend the Church concludes its liturgical season by celebrating the Solemnity of Christ the King. Thus the celebration of Christ the King was placed at the end of the Church year and right before the beginning of a new liturgical year to proclaim that Jesus Christ is the first and the last, the beginning and the end, the alpha and the omega. All things are made for Him and unto Him. He is our Lord. May He always reign over every aspect of our lives.

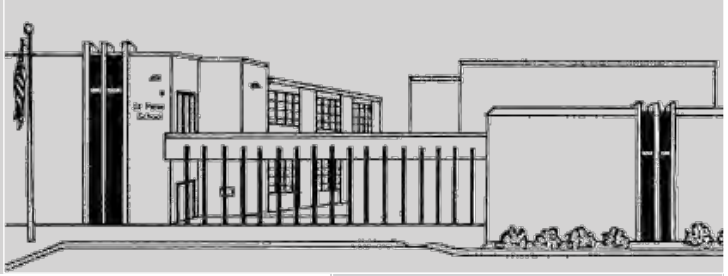
As we reflect upon this Solemnity, the Church gives us a beautiful explanation in the preface of our Mass. It states: *“For you anointed your only Begotten Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, with the oil of gladness as eternal Priest and King of all creation, so that, by offering Himself on the altar of the Cross as a spotless sacrifice to bring us peace, He might accomplish the mysteries of human redemption and, making all created things subject to His rule, He might present to the immensity of your majesty an eternal and universal kingdom, a kingdom of truth and life, a kingdom of holiness and grace, a kingdom of justice, love, and peace.”* Jesus is truly this King and His Kingdom is here among us. Let us live in it accordingly.

This Monday, November 27, the Quincy deanery will be having what is called an “Andrew Dinner.” The Bishop will be here and this dinner will be held out at St. Anthony Church with Fr. Tom Donovan as our host. Just as St. Andrew the apostle brought his brother, St. Peter, to Jesus, so we as priests have invited many of our high school and college young men to this dinner and to consider priesthood as a vocation. There is no commitment, nor will they be tied up until they decide in our favor. No, it is an opportunity to have our priests share their vocations and ask these young men to allow God and His grace to touch their lives in whatever capacity. It will be a very nice evening. As we enjoy this dinner, I continue to ask you to pray for more vocations to the priesthood and religious life. The Church needs your prayers.

Next weekend, Fr. Kolbe Woniakowski, a Benedictine Monk and Priest, will be with us to present an Advent Mission. He will speak at all the Masses on Sunday, as well as giving two conferences on Monday and Tuesday, December 4 and 5 at 6:30 p.m. in Church. You are invited and encouraged to join us as we use Advent to get ourselves ready for the presence of Christ, especially His presence in the Eucharist. Fr. Kolbe went to the Seminary with Fr. Zach at St. Meinrad School of Theology. His topic will be the Eucharist and how it relates to the Advent season. There will be a reception to follow after the final conference on Tuesday in the cafeteria. Childcare for ages one and older will be available in the Martha Jane Room next to the cafeteria.

This Wednesday, November 29, we will have PSR reconciliation for our students at 6:30 p.m. Then on the following Tuesday, December 5, we will be celebrating the Sacraments of Reconciliation for our students of St. Peter Grade School from 8:45 to 11:00 a.m. Through these days, we will assist our young people to “make ready the way of the Lord” through this Sacrament.

Next weekend, we begin another liturgical year with the First Sunday of Advent. This liturgical year will be **Year B** in our Sunday cycle of readings and **Cycle II** in the weekday cycle of readings.

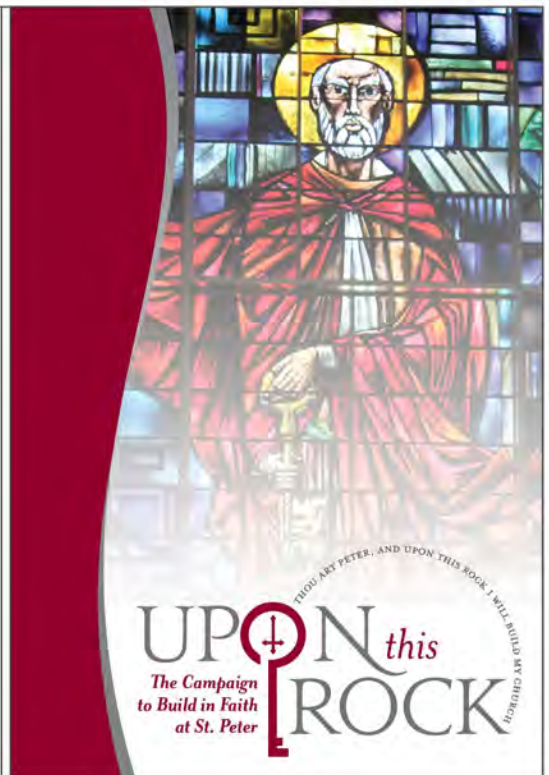
