

ICC Update on Issues Related to our New Parking Lot. The last time we kept you up to date, this summer past, we told you about a few things we could do, and some things we had to wait on, because of the lack of rain. We told you we'd get back to you in the fall. As you can see when you come to church, there's still some landscaping work to be done: now, besides waiting for rain, we're waiting for spring. Has to be. Be assured that the part of our grounds in front of the parish hall, and the grounds near our Shrine to Our Lady of Guadalupe, will be addressed in the spring. You'll see some dirt piled on our property in advance of completing the project. Also: we will immediately begin work on our ramp and walkway leading to the main doors of the church. Some cracks and openings in the concrete are bound to lead to interior damage and we're going to take care of that problem quickly. Finally, you'll notice some grooves drilled out of sections of the curb in proximity to where the old rectory used to be. This will allow for water drainage without mud and dirt covering our sidewalk on Fayette Street. Just so you know.....Fr. T.


IC Catholic Women's Club will meet Monday, November 6 at 6 p.m., parish hall. All are welcome!






