Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

NOVEMBER 5, 2023

Malachi 1:14b–2:2b,8-10; 1 Thessalonians 2:7b-9,13; Matthew 23:1-12

(One sentence in today's Gospel is often quoted against Catholics: "Call no man 'Father.'" When others use this as a text against calling priests 'Father,' show them 1 Corinthians 4:14-15 where Paul says that he is a father to the Corinthians. The Scriptures cannot contradict themselves; therefore it is legitimate to call priests 'Father.')

Today's Scripture readings deal with ministry and priesthood, but they can also be applied to anyone in public service. The message is that we must serve and not be served. We are not to seek our own glory, but the glory of God.

The background of the Gospel is the situation in Matthew's community around the year 80 A.D. After the destruction of Jerusalem in 70 A.D., the only surviving Jews were Pharisees who went to Jabneh (Jamnia), a seacoast town on the Mediterranean, where they tried to preserve Judaism.

They established all kinds of rules. They began using the titles "rabbi" (meaning "great one") and gloried in prestige and honor. They also condemned all who acknowledged Jesus as Messiah. Matthew's community consisted of Jewish Christians. They were torn apart by the decisions of Jamnia. Matthew calls them back to Jesus Christ. He came to serve, not to be served.

No one should seek honors or prestige; rather he should seek to be of service to others. The person who humbles himself will be exalted. Matthew thoroughly condemns the Pharisaism of Jamnia.

In the second reading, Paul reminds the Thessalonians that he was never a burden to them. He worked for his living as a tentmaker, and did not charge them for preaching the Gospel. This showed his genuineness; they received the word of God.

The first reading tells us not to be partial in giving decisions. We must not seek favor with other people, but must always give glory to God. Every public servant must be humble, selfless.

Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time, November 5, 2023 Dear Parishioners,


Well we celebrate the first weekend in our new month of November. This weekend if you remember, we turn our clocks back thus enabling us to get another hour of sleep for those who are interested. Whatever the case, the days will be shorter and the nights longer as we prepare to enter into the winter season. Let's hope and pray that the snow and ice will be delayed for several weeks and we might enjoy some fall-like weather.

During the month of November, the Church invites us to remember those who have died. And so we have the Book of the Dead front and center before the Easter candle, as a reminder to us of our obligation to pray for the deceased. In this Book of the Dead, we have the names of those parishioners who have died during this past year and were buried from St. Peter Church. But I'm sure that there are many other relatives and/or friends who have died and need to be remembered in prayer. "May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed, rest in peace. Amen"

As we are invited to remember those who have died, let us also remember the places of burial, namely, our Catholic cemeteries of Quincy. As you should know, we have been making many improvements to these special places for our deceased. But any improvement we make comes at a cost. And it is through your generosity at this time that we can continue making the necessary improvements. Yes, families do pay a long term care but that doesn't include any improvements but rather just maintenance and care of the burial plots. The roads, the care of the trees, and any other improvements are made through the generosity of our parish families whose loved ones are buried in these sacred places. So I am asking for your generosity this year as we balance our needs with extra income from you to enhance the beauty of these sacred places for our deceased. In your packet of parish envelopes you will find a special cemetery collection envelope. Please help us this year with your donation and then place it in the collection basket. Thank you for helping us keep our cemeteries as places of eternal rest for our loved ones.

TODAY IS COMMITMENT SUNDAY. Today all parish families are asked to bring their Commitment Card to Mass or complete a card online at our parish website, www.cospq.org. During Mass, as a parish community, we offer God our gifts of time, talent, and treasure. Our goal is to be a stewardship parish—a community who is noticeably committed to prayer, parish ministry, and generous financial support. All three are equally important. May God bless you as you discern how God is calling you to grow closer to Him this year. I also want to personally thank those who will be speaking at our Masses this weekend for sharing their stewardship with us and how that has changed their outlook.

As we think about being a stewardship parish, Jesus gives us some solid advice on what a steward is to be. After going after the leaders of Israel for their hypocrisy, criticizing them for placing undo burdens on people, Jesus then beautifully states: "the greatest among you must be your servant. Whoever exalts himself/herself, will be humbled, but whoever humbles himself/herself will be exalted." A steward is one who serves and serves with a humble heart.
