Today we celebrate the 1st Sunday of Advent. We bless our Advent wreath today and light our first of four Advent candles. This season of Advent is a hope-filled season which speaks to us about the three Coming's of Christ: history, mystery, and glory. Although our Advent attention is strongly affixed to Christ's historical coming in Bethlehem, the Church invites us to consider his *present coming in mystery* and his *future coming in glory*. It is Christ's glorious coming to which the gospel refers to today. "Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come." Because we do not know the timing of Christ's coming, we should always be prepared and alert awaiting his return.

This Fri. Dec. 8th we celebrate the **Solemnity** of the Immaculate Conception, which is a Holy Day of Obligation. We have 2 Masses available:

Saint Antoine, Haiti

Our Haiti Committee recently participated in video calls with members of our Sister Parish, St. Antoine in Haiti . We spoke with Sister Inocencia who works at the Clinic, & also Maculaine, a young lady who lives there. The clinic often sees 50-60 people a day who come looking for medicine, food & water. Many can't afford to pay, & they do not have enough medicine for everyone at this time even if they could. It's hard to get supplies & when they can, everything is very expensive. They could use more money for food & medicine. They also asked for prayers for Sister Helene, who works at the clinic & is ill.

We also spoke with Father Michel Lops, Pastor of the Parish. He was outside because the power was out, which is a constant problem. He said life is very difficult for the 400+ parishioners that regularly attend Mass. They need help coordinating new latrine projects if possible. He said they're so grateful for our support & they pray for us daily Thanks to Marceau who interpreted for us!
