While the entire existence of the **Season of Advent** is ordered toward a fruitful celebration of Christmas, the spiritual patterns and postures of the Advent season point to a deeper anticipation for deliverance written in human heart. Mark proclaims, "In those days, after that suffering, the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from heaven, and the powers

of the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in clouds' with great power and glory!" (Mark 13:23-26) The Lord who is yet to come, the one who we commemorate as the gentle baby of the manger in Bethlehem, is the Son of Man who reveals God's mercy and deliverance over the calamity and catastrophe that still envelops the world. As if under the cover of darkness he slips across enemy lines, barely noticed by the powers of the world, but on the day of his revelation, the stars and heavens themselves will announce his coming through signs and wonders. The Christ Child was, and again will be, a consolation to those who believe and the beginning of the end to those who would oppose him. His is the paradox of power in weakness, of speechless wisdom, and of humble kingship. As the Season of Advent unfolds, we take time to become comfortable once again with the mystery of God's revelation in human flesh, confident that his return is at hand. May this Advent prepare us well for the worthy and joyous celebration of **Christmas 2023!**

Wednesday, December 8 is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, a Holy Day of Obligation.

Masses will be at 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday, December 7 at St. Anthony, Wednesday at 7:30 a.m. at St. Anthony, 9:00 a.m. at St. Dominic, and 6:30 p.m. at St. Anthony.

The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception commemorates the special privilege afforded to Mary, that from the very moment of her conception, she would be preserved from sin by the grace and mercy of her son. It is through the divine grace that dwelt in her with a perfection never before seen in the human race, that without reservation or concupiscence

she was able to say 'yes' to God's plan to share our human nature and redeem it, as if from the 'inside-out'. Thus, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is a preeminent celebration of Advent and ultimately, the Incarnation. Through Mary's yes, the old order passes away and the people of God learn a 'new song'... a new pattern, a new rhythm of living in the grace of God. We are no longer separated; we are no longer orphans. We are brothers and sisters in Christ by the generous gift he gives of himself: "Sing to the Lord a new Song, for He has done marvelous deeds!" (Psalm 98)
