Second Sunday of Advent

DECEMBER 10, 2023

Isaiah 40:1-5,9-11; 2 Peter 3:8-14; Mark 1:1-8

Jewish tradition expected that everything would be instantly perfect when the Messiah came. There would be justice, peace, an end to all suffering and death, plenty of food and of the good things of earth for every faithful person. It didn't happen that way.

The primitive Church saw the problem: Jesus IS the Messiah; why then aren't things perfect? The Church proclaimed that all would be perfect when Jesus the Messiah returned in his glory. And that would be very soon. But it didn't happen.

Our second reading is a sort of rationalization at the delay in the glorious Coming of Christ (the Parousia.) It tells us that a day is as a thousand years, and vice versa, in God's eyes. According to his time frame, it has only been a couple of days since Jesus ascended to heaven. What happens when our expectations are not fulfilled? Do we lose hope? Are we embittered?

Our first reading is from the second part of Isaiah; it was written toward the end of the Babylonian Captivity. The Jews in exile expected liberation; they expected that the Messiah would come immediately and that all would be perfect.

The reading begins the section of Isaiah called "The Book of Consolation." The captivity (service) of the Jews is at an end, but they must make ready for the Coming of the Lord.

Jewish tradition taught that the Messiah would come instantly *IF* everyone repented at exactly the same time! It's not bad theology! If we all repented and prepared, surely the Lord would come in glory.

The Gospel is the beginning of Mark's Gospel: John the Baptist calls on us to "turn our lives around," to make straight a way for the Lord. If all of us do, then surely we would see the glory of the Lord.

Second Sunday of Advent, December 10, 2023


Dear Parishioners,

In my younger days as a priest, I met one of my classmates in St. Louis and we would attend the St. Louis Symphony in their presentation of Handel's classic work called the Messiah. In one of the movements in this classic musical, we find Handel giving comfort and good tidings to the people of Israel. I bring this to your attention because the initial vocal parts of this composition draw heavily upon the verses we find from our first reading from Isaiah. Listen to the words which state: "Comfort ve, comfort ye my people, saith your God. Speak ye comfortably to Jerusalem, and cry unto her, that her warfare is accomplished, that her iniquity is pardoned. The voice of him that crieth in the wilderness, 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God.' Every valley shall be exalted, and every mountain and hill made low, the crooked straight, and the rough places plain. And the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together: for the mouth of the Lord hath spoken it." Of course after several more movements, it would lead to the climax of the night with the beautiful "Alleluia chorus." Even though I am not a music buff, I always enjoyed that evening as it led to the chorus in which every one seemed to sing, "Alleluia." That one word seems to capture the mystery of Christmas, God dwelling among us with our only response being, "Alleluia!"

Our gospel for this second Sunday of Advent introduces us to a man who prepared the people for the coming of the Messiah, namely, John the Baptist. His distinct role was to proclaim a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. In other words, people were challenged by John to rethink one's life and to recognize the need for forgiveness for all the bad decisions that we have made. Now no one likes to have their wrongdoings pointed out but it is only through such an act of humility that we will change our ways and return to the Lord. And that is what Advent is all about. So an essential part of our Advent season is to do some introspection, to see where we have missed the mark as our Scripture describes sin and somehow through the mercy and forgiveness of Christ and His Church, make straight His paths in our lives. As part of our Advent experience, we will be celebrating a city wide Penance Service next Sunday, December 17, at 2:00 p.m. in St. Francis Solanus Church. There will be a number of priests from the community who will be present to celebrate individual confessions. So please mark your schedules and be in attendance to receive God's forgiveness and get your lives ready for the mystery of Christmas. If you cannot make it then, of course we always hear confessions each Saturday, from 7:30-7:50 a.m. and again from 3:30-4:30 p.m. each Saturday afternoon. We will also be having special times for individual confessions on Friday and Saturday, December 22-23. But please don't wait for the last times but make Confessions an essential part of your Advent practice.

Also, I want to invite you to the Quincy Notre Dame & PMO Choir Concert. These students will be sharing their musical talents with the community this Monday, December 11, at 6:30 p.m. in St. Peter Church. This is always one of those concerts that make us so proud of the talents of our young people who will help us make ready our lives for Christmas. Come and join us.


