

#### **Preparation for Christmas**

It's the most difficult thing to understand about Catholics in the present day: how we minimize and even deny the Lord's institution of the sacrament of Penance. Biblically, there's no justification for rejecting or dismissing this sacrament. On the night of His Resurrection, Jesus imparted to his apostles a tremendous power to forgive sins: "Whose sins you shall forgive are forgiven them; whose sins you retain are retained." (Gospel of John) How is it possible that an all-knowing God, the Resurrected Lord Jesus Christ, would give the apostles this power, and then render it meaningless by nullifying its exercise?

Throughout this week, from Sunday through Thursday, opportunities for Confession abound. Confession is the renewal and purification of your Baptism promises. Think about what you want to tell God you're sorry about - recent or distant past. Jesus, from His place in heaven, wants to impart a grace through your priests. And yes - your priests need to meet the Lord in confession, too. Our parish prayer book has an examination of conscience to assist you. Confession can be as commonplace or as deeply moving as your soul's need. But don't go looking for an emotional high. Instead, with any regular practice of Confession, look for the deepening challenge to fight against sin - and then, the joy of overcoming what's holding your spiritual life down. Fr. T.

Confession Schedule in Preparation for Christmas and Christmas Mass schedule. The following is the schedule for the opportunity of Confession, in preparation for a meaningful reception of our Lord in the Holy Eucharist on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.

SPPN, Sunday, December 17, from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. SHW, Monday, December 18, from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. SMH, Tuesday, December 19, from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. SHDC, Wednesday, December 20, from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. ICC, Thursday, December 21, from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m.

We are happy and honored to be available for Confessions before and after morning weekday Masses.

As for the weekend Masses December 23 and 24: the weekend Confession schedule remains, but please try not to squeeze into these "last minute" times. We have a full weekend Mass schedule, followed by a full Christmas Mass schedule. Time and schedule are stretched to the limit, as it is.

The following is the schedule for Mass on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. Keep in mind that this is the second year of a five-year schedule of rotation, so that each of our churches has the opportunity to host the most desired Masses and Mass times for Christmas and Easter.

Christmas Eve, December 24:

4:00 p.m. Mass at Immaculate Conception Church in Carthage (with a special visitor!).
7:00 p.m. Mass at Sacred Heart Church in Dallas City.
10:00 p.m. Mass at Sacred Heart Church in Warsaw.
Christmas Day, December 25:

8:00 a.m. Mass at St. Mary Church in Hamilton. 10:00 a.m. Mass at Sts. Peter and Paul Church in Nauvoo.

The parishioners of St. Mary's face a significant challenge. The parish hall heating system must be replaced, at a cost of about \$10,000. The Trustees presented the challenge following Mass last Saturday evening. As expected, the response has been positive and immediate. A member of the congregation, who wishes to remain anonymous, has established a matching challenge. They will match all contributions made for the project by December 28, up to a maximum of \$5000.
