

For both Christmas and New Years Day - the Solemnities of the Birth of Jesus Christ and the Mystery of Mary the Mother of God - we set up a generous, really extravagant, Mass schedule. We did this for two reasons. First, our Sunday obligation to be present at the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ at Mass - that's what the Mass is - is separate from our obligation to participate in Christmas and New Year's Day (January 1 is the Solemnity of Mary the Mother of God). These obligations aren't combined into one; their focus is on separate facets of the mystery of the life of Christ. Second, I don't want to rearrange the Mass schedule in such a way as to cause suspicion whether we're tipping off decisions from Growing Disciples. We won't know what those decisions will be for some time yet. In the meantime, we maintain a Mass schedule that includes all of our churches. Please consult the bulletin to remain informed about our Mass schedule as we enter into the year 2024.

Fr. Tony's Retreat and Time Away Schedule, 2024. Hate to admit it, but I think I need it! Hope you understand! I will be on retreat, and at the same time, assisting as spiritual director for St. Louis Archdiocesan seminarians from the afternoon of January 7 through January 12, 2024. And I will be away for rest from February 5 through February 16 - with a brief return to be here for Ash Wednesday, February 14. *These commitments will make it impossible for me to return quickly for any emergency needs which may arise.* I thank Fr. James for his presence, his increasing assistance in the priestly ministry of our churches and school, and for his availability while I am gone. Fr. T.

The parishioners of St. Mary's face a significant challenge. The parish hall heating system must be replaced, at a cost of about \$10,000.
