Fourth Sunday of Advent

DECEMBER 24, 2023

2 Samuel 7:1-5,8b-12,14a,16;
Romans 16:25-27; Luke 1:26-38

Our God is the God of the unexpected and the unhopd for. In the first reading, God promised that the dynasty of David would last forever. This promise was handed down for centuries, even though the descendants of David were worthless and corrupt.

It was unhopd for that a descendant of David could be righteous – but the Lord promised it. The promise was fulfilled in Jesus of Nazareth, the Son of David.

The second reading reflects the unhopd for reconciliation of Jew and Gentile. Jews hated Gentiles as corrupt, immoral, pagan, and evil. Gentiles (non-Jews) hated Jews as condescending, snobbish, arrogant, picky people who separated themselves from others. Yet Jew and Gentile are united in Jesus, Messiah for the Jews and Savior for the Gentiles.

Jewish tradition never expected a divine Messiah nor the Virgin birth. But beyond expectation, God himself became man; he took human nature, being born of the ever-Virgin Mary!

If God has done the unexpected and unhopd for in the past, he can also do it now! He can even convert us to be his holy people. He can change our lives and our world. Let us renew our faith and our hope in the God of unexpected joy.

4TH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

This weekend we have the gift of celebrating both the fourth Sunday of Advent and Christmas! With this we only have one bulletin for both. So, Blessed Fourth Sunday of Advent to you AND Merry Christmas! What a crazy moment. We barely light the fourth candle of the Advent Wreath and blow them all out before turning around to celebrate Christmas Eve and the Birth of Jesus Christ into our world.

The readings this weekend tell us of an everlasting kingdom in the lineage of David and the promise fulfilled of that Kingdom in the answer of Mary to the Archangel Gabriel. This is a reminder of the fact that God keeps His promises and loves us enough to humble Himself to come and save us. In our Christmas readings they point us to that lineage of Jesus fulfilling the line of David and the connection to Abraham. They tell us of the story of the birth of Christ, and the response of the shepherds hearing the announcement of the birth. What a whirlwind of intense stories and theology and love. The message, our God loves us so much that He came in the form of a little child to bring us His everlasting presence to save us. How beautiful.

I cannot thank the Lord enough for the privilege to pastor this amazing parish. I am so grateful for each and every one of you. I finally feel like I am getting to know you all more and more. Continue to introduce yourselves, especially if we haven't gotten to speak. Continue to tell me your stories and lives, as I long to hear them and know them.

Thank you for your faith, your immense stewardship, and your love. Our parish is amazing, alive, and on fire with the Holy Spirit. We continue to grow as we reach out and welcome and invite. We continue to expand as we teach and love and guide. Let's make this parish witness as the humble shepherds to the joy of Christmas now, and always.

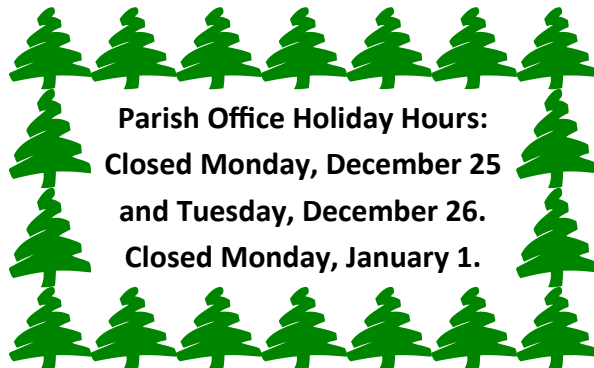


