Fourth Sunday of Advent

DECEMBER 24, 2023

2 Samuel 7:1-5,8b-12,14a,16; Romans 16:25-27; Luke 1:26-38

Our God is the God of the unexpected and the unhoped for. In the first reading, God promised that the dynasty of David would last forever. This promise was handed down for centuries, even though the descendants of David were worthless and corrupt.

It was unhoped for that a descendant of David could be righteous – but the Lord promised it. The promise was fulfilled in Jesus of Nazareth, the Son of David.

The second reading reflects the unhoped for reconciliation of Jew and Gentile. Jews hated Gentiles as corrupt, immoral, pagan, and evil. Gentiles (non-Jews) hated Jews as condescending, snobbish, arrogant, picky people who separated themselves from others. Yet Jew and Gentile are united in Jesus, Messiah for the Jews and Savior for the Gentiles.

Jewish tradition never expected a divine Messiah nor the Virgin birth. But beyond expectation, God himself became man; he took human nature, being born of the ever-Virgin Mary!

If God has done the unexpected and unhoped for in the past, he can also do it now! He can even convert us to be his holy people. He can change our lives and our world. Let us renew our faith and our hope in the God of unexpected joy.

Fourth Sunday of Advent, December 24, 2023

Dear Parishioners,

We gather today to celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Advent, a celebration of only a few hours before we go into our celebration of Christmas. This shortened Advent season is the result of Christmas falling on a Monday, and thus we find ourselves celebrating Advent and Christmas within a few hours of each other. We also found ourselves with a dilemma, namely, when do we decorate for Christmas. No one wanted to decorate on Christmas Eve, with family and friends being so much a part of our Christmas Eve celebration. So we decided to do so in advance, hoping that our parishioners would understand. Whatever the case, we will try to highlight both the 4th Sunday in Advent and then proceed into our celebration of Christmas.

Our gospel reading for this 4th Sunday of Advent presents the angel Gabriel announcing to Mary God's intention for her in her life. His message would turn her life upside down and her life would never be the same. She was called to be the Mother of God and this call would be filled with many unknowns in her future. No longer would she be a simple, humble housewife, but now she was asked to prepare her Son to become Israel's Messiah and Savior of the world. And she would be doing this with the cloud of misunderstanding and judgement because she was with child and it wasn't her future husbands. Imagine how frightening this was for Mary. But because God had given her grace, she was able trust in Him and say those beautiful words we all need to hear, "Behold I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word." Lesson learned from Mary, we might find ourselves in similar situations, God asking us something beyond what we think we can do. With God's grace, we too like Mary can pray that we do His will and not our own.

Now we move into our Christmas celebration. Perhaps the good news of our solemnity of Christmas is found in the words of the angel who appeared to the shepherds in the field. The angel said to them and to us this day, "do not be afraid, for behold, I proclaim to you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For today in the city of David a Savior has been born for you who is Christ and Lord." My brothers and sisters, the mystery of Christmas is remembered, celebrated, and lived. As we proclaim throughout this celebration, "Today is born our Savior, Christ the Lord." On behalf of our parish staff, the administration and teachers in our school, and Fr. Zach Samples and myself, I want to wish each and every one of you a very Blessed and Merry Christmas. As we celebrate this Christmas Day, I am very conscious of the gifts that this parish has been personally to me. Thank you for making Christmas so much alive and present through your continual stewardship, your gifts of time, talents, and treasures that are present throughout this season and throughout the entire year. God bless and love you!
