LEGION OF MARY

January 1. **Solemnity of Mary's Divine Motherhood** is one of the four dogmas stating Mary's personal relationship with God and her role in human salvation. Mary's divine motherhood was proclaimed at the Council of Ephesus in 431. Various names are used to describe Mary's role as mother of Jesus. She is called "Mother of God" which translates the more accurately stated Greek term "Theotokos" or "Birthgiver of God."
