

This Year's Sermon Outline, Continued.

Let's begin to take our long, strung-out presentation of the Church's foundational principles of the sexual moral life, by applying them to the teaching on Artificial Contraception. This will include the teaching on Abortion. Keep in mind the following stepping stones serving as our guide: the five dimensions of the human person, man and woman; the three dimensions of society; the natural law and the common good; and the subjective and objective standards of morality.

There are also a few things we need to do to make sure there is public access to rights with regard to the use of cemeteries. I want to thank all of our people who have so diligently and thoroughly provided oversight and care of our cemetery properties. In the near future, we will be reviving cemetery trustee and committee meetings to make sure that once we are current, we stay current.
