Third Sunday in Ordinary 7ime **JANUARY 21. 2024**

Jonah 3:1-5; 1 Corinthians 7:29-31: Mark 1:14-20

A common thread in each of today's Scripture readings is: "The time is short!" Therefore, we should change our ways and live for the Lord.

The first reading is from the parable of Jonah. This book of the Bible is an extended parable - a fictional story with a spectacular ending used to teach a religious lesson.

God tells Jonah to go to Nineveh to announce its destruction. Jonah, like all good Jews, hated the monstrous Ninevites; he did not want to warn them; he thought their destruction was good riddance.

He tried to escape aboard a ship; a storm came up; Jonah says that he was the cause. He is thrown overboard, swallowed by a great fish, and for three days has a chance to reconsider going to Nineveh! Our reading takes up from here. Much to Jonah's surprise, when he announces Nineveh's destruction, the pagans repent!

In the second reading, Paul tells the Corinthians that the time is short. Therefore they should live in this world in expectation of the world to come.

Today's Gospel tells a story of the call of the first disciples very different from last Sunday's account. Jesus proclaims that the time of fulfillment is at hand; the reign of God is here; therefore everyone should repent. Very likely the first disciples left their homes and work in expectation that the end was coming.

What are a few short years on earth compared to eternity? In our present attitude, we might consider that the end is far away. But time has a way of speeding by geometric increments! We should live each day as if it is our last. We should always ask ourselves, "How does this word or action fit in with my eternal goal?" The time is short; live for the Lord.

Dear Parishioners,

With our celebration of Christmas, we recognize God's desire to share His life with us as He shares our life with Him. Ever since creation, God has intended that we be one with Him. It is only because of sin that separation and alienation has taken place. But God refuses to accept this separation and has entered our world to save us from ourselves and to grace us with His presence. His love truly is everlasting. And so what we find on this Third Sunday of Ordinary Time, Jesus proclaiming the gospel message: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the gospel." Rather than live in isolation from our God, the message of the gospel that Jesus proclaimed is to change our ways and to turn back to our God. And when we do, we will find once again that intimate union with our loving Father. This is quite evident in our first reading from the Book of Jonah. In this reading, Jonah was called by God to preach repentance from the bitter enemies of Israel. Translation, God's love and forgiveness is enduring and does not exclude anyone who turns back to our God. And the last words of our reading says it all. "When God saw by their actions how they turned from their evil way, He repented of the evil that He had threatened to do to them; He did not carry it out." This is our hope if only we too will repent and turn back to our God.

Starting next weekend, January 27-28, St. Peter School will be celebrating Catholic School's Week. Last week we published the various activities which will commemorate this week with each day having its own theme. Next weekend, we celebrate Catholic School's Week in our parish. Our students will be taking various roles at our Masses over the weekend and there will even be a slideshow prior to each Mass depicting the appreciation of our students for the privilege of attending St. Peter School. As a way to show this appreciation, we will also be having our 11th annual St. Peter School Pancake Breakfast on Sunday, in the gym from 8:30-12:30 p.m. We invite you to come over and enjoy a great time, and if you so wish, to catch your pancakes on your own plates as they are tossed in the air. Chris Cakes from St. Louis will be providing the food and entertainment for this breakfast. If not willing to catch your own, they will instead be handed to you for your consumption. 

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Soon our diocese will take up the Collection for the Church in Latin America. For more than 50 years, this collection has been a way for Catholics in the United States to unite more closely with our brothers and sisters in faith throughout Latin America and the Caribbean through supporting diocesan pastoral catechetical and family life ministries, seminary studies, and formation programs for religious sisters and brothers. The collection even helps the poorest dioceses obtain basic necessities that they otherwise would be unable to afford, which would leave them unable to minister effectively to the faithful.

At the far eastern end of the island of Cuba, the priests in the Diocese of Guantanamo-Baracoa traverse bad roads over rough terrain to bring the sacraments and the Word of God to the faithful living there. The mountainous territory that makes up 75% of the diocese's total land area makes travel not only difficult but also more expensive for priests due to higher fuel consumption, vehicle maintenance, and repair costs compared to other regions.

Catholics like you who generously contribute to the Collection for the Church in Latin America help Guantanamo -Baracoa's priests stay on the road with funds given to the diocese to offset fuel and vehicle repair costs. In places such as Cuba, you help bring the Good News to the poor when you participate in the collection.

Our diocese takes up this collection on the weekend of January 27/28, 2024. Please be generous toward this collection. Consider giving at Mass or through your parish's online giving platform. The #iGiveCatholicTogether (usccb.igivecatholictogether.org/organizations/usccbchurch-in-latin-america) website also accepts online funds for the collection. Your support truly makes a difference. 
