#### **Food Pantry Donations at Work**

Over the Christmas season we indicated that we had donations to the Christmas gift card program of up \$5,000+. In addition we ordered ham and holiday fixings for the Christmas family meal from NIFB. Our clients were most appreciative of your generosity as am I and the volunteers at the pantry.

Your donations are the biggest part of our income throughout the year. They provide food and substance for 2,568 client visits, made up of children, seniors and adults totaling 7,895 people served in 2023.

Your generosity allowed us to spend a little over \$50,000 to provide assistance to those in need. Some of the categories are noted below:

- 1. \$4.500 in rent assistance
- 2. \$6,700 utility expenses, gasoline cards and bereavement expenses.
- 3. \$35,000 on our Aldi gift cards to be used on items the client needs that we don't have at the time (e.g. dairy, commodities, cleaning supplies etc.)
- 4. \$3,500 misc. operating expenses, supplies, etc.

We hope that this information gives you an idea of how your donations are being spent. Our pantry is overwhelmed by your generosity. We couldn't exist without you.
