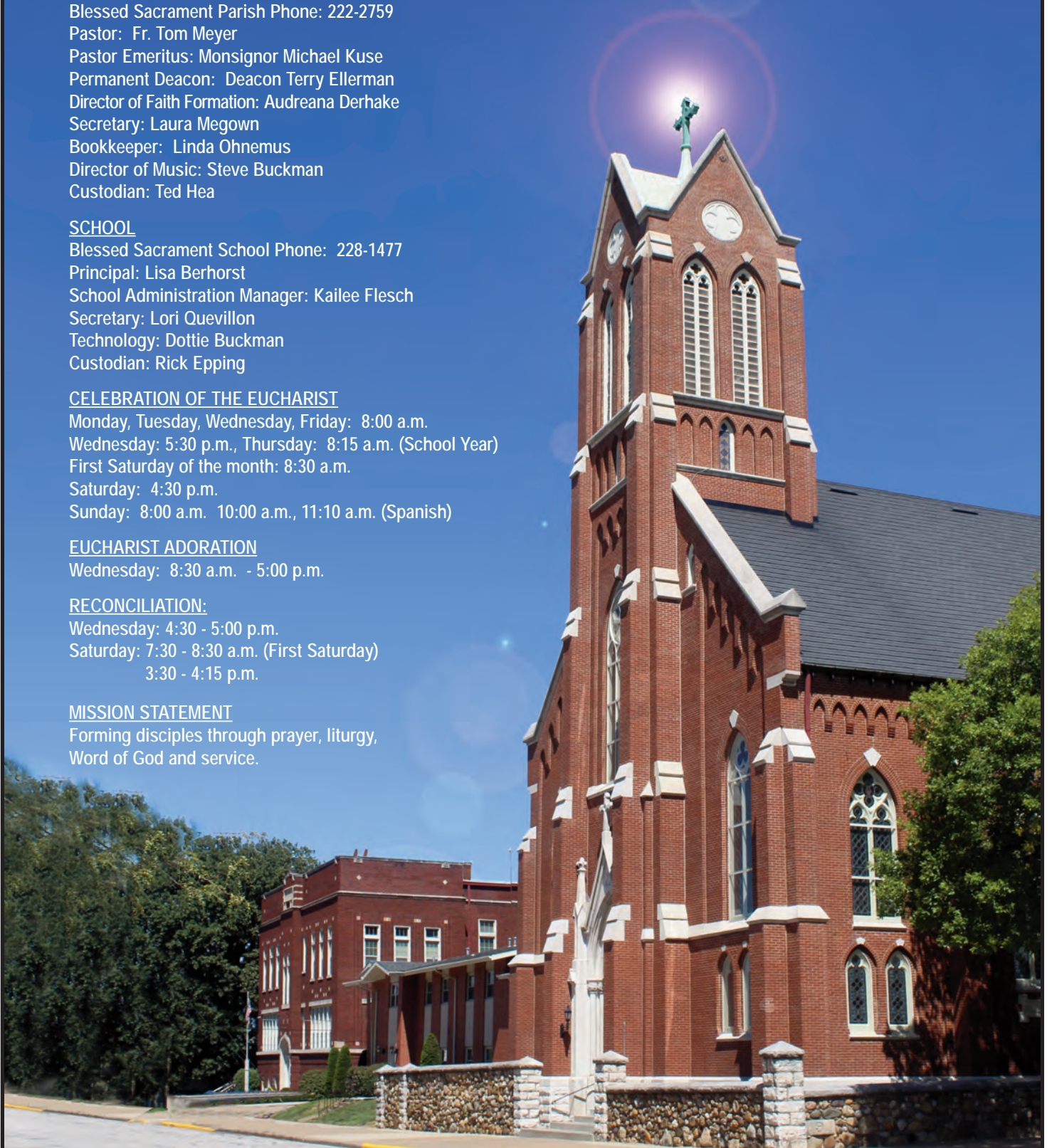

From the Pastor's Desk

Today we celebrate the **Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord**. Today we celebrate the visit of the Magi to the infant Jesus. The Magi represent the Gentiles to whom our Lord intended to include in his gift of salvation. The Gentiles were not the original Chosen People, but our Lord always intended to include them in his plan of salvation. In God's plan Israel was to be like the Star of Bethlehem – a light to the nations to guide them to the Lord. Like Israel, the Church today is called to be the star to guide people today on their path to the Lord.

Last weekend I mentioned that our **Sister Parish of St. Antoinnes in Haiti had a break-in** on the day after Christmas, and all of their musical instruments and sound equipment were stolen. This weekend is our regular 1st Sunday of the month when we take up our Sister Parish Collection. So I encourage all of us to consider giving a little extra this weekend to help our Sister Parish begin to buy new musical instruments and sound equipment.

Tomorrow (Monday) we celebrate the **Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord**. Tomorrow we celebrate the manifestation of Jesus during his baptism in the Jordan River. It is not a Holy Day of Obligation, yet we are all encouraged to attend and recall our own Baptism. Tomorrow's Solemnity officially **Closes out the Christmas Season**. This Tuesday we return to the season of Ordinary Time. We will march through the season of Ordinary Time for the next 5 ½ weeks until Ash Wednesday, which falls this year on Wednesday, February 14.

This month we begin collecting subscription money for our Diocesan Newspaper, the **Catholic Times**. I encourage our parishioners to include \$15.00 in your Catholic Times envelope for your annual CT subscription. You may return your envelope in the collection anytime in the next few weeks.

Our Accounting Office is making available **Printed copies of your annual 2023 Financial contribution statements** for you to pick up in church. In the upcoming weeks we will have labeled and sealed envelopes containing your contribution information that you can use in preparing your tax return. Envelopes will be sorted alphabetically, and we encourage you to pick up your sealed envelope before or after Mass.

I will soon begin **Server Training with our 4th Grade students and any other interested students in Grades 5-8**. This training usually takes 4-5 weeks to complete. I hope to have a New Server Commissioning on Sunday, February 4.

Finally, on **Saturday, January 27**, we will have a **Healing Service after the 4:30 p.m. Mass**. We are inviting Roger Shaner to join us from Hancock County, who was a speaker at our Men's Conference back in early December. Roger has discerned a gift of healing: spiritual, emotional, and physical. On a monthly basis, St. Mary's Church in Hamilton has a Healing Service in which Roger shares this gift of healing. Blessed Sacrament has invited him to join us here for a Healing Service on Saturday, January 27 after the 4:30 p.m. Mass. It will include the healing ministry of Roger Shaner, intercessory prayer to Fr. Augustus Tolton (in the event of a physical healing that would advance his cause for canonization), and the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please consider joining us to receive this gift of healing, or join us in intercessory prayer for those who seek it.

Saint Antoine, Haiti

We have remained in steady contact with our Sister Parish in Haiti.

One thing that has remained constant, is their suffering. We are tempted to take this for granted because of its ever-presence, and sometimes it feels easier to just not think about it—out of sight, out of mind.

But if suffering unites us to Christ in a special way, let us not bury our heads in the sand when it comes to the hardships our Haitian brothers and sisters are facing.

If we don't think about them, how can we pray for them? If we do not pray for them, how can the Holy Spirit move us to help provide for their material needs out of our own abundance, let alone out of our own need?

Father Michel Lops, Pastor of Saint Antoine, said they need our help and our prayers. In fact, he says, they are counting on us. They evangelize us by sharing Christ's suffering with us. In turn, we have the opportunity to evangelize by fulfilling Christ's promise to provide for their needs, and through our works, offering the only true abundance that sweeps away all scarcity: the abundance of God's love, and His hope.
