

While Fr. Tony Is Away.

The introduction to the sermon series concerning the Church's teaching on Artificial Birth Control took place at Mass with Facebook access during the extensive winter cancellations. We'll be revisiting that entry into this moral teaching, and continuing its development. This is where everybody's patience is tested, for preacher, those opposed, and those in favor. Keep in mind that the major point in much need of being addressed is this: the connection between moral choices in the personal life, and their effect on the bigger picture in which we all live. We live in a time when the personal life is all that matters. You can't be concerned only with that in the moral life; there's a connection between the personal - even the personally intimate - and the public, extending throughout the social order. That connection is what we're going to explain.

The Season of Lent, 2024. The season of Lent begins with the celebration of Ash Wednesday on February 14. This season of openness to conversion of mind and heart to God the Father, through union with Jesus on his path to suffering and death, in the unity of the Holy Spirit is always an excellent opportunity to draw closer to the Lord, and to deepen our spiritual lives. Your Lenten Resolution can include prayer, sacrifice translated into help for the poor, and self-denial for the sake of the purification of the soul and a deeper spiritual maturity following the path of Jesus. Here are the opportunities for this year's season of Lent.

Masses for Ash Wednesday, February 14th. Mass with the distribution of ashes will take place at our churches as follows:

7 a.m. at St. Mary Church, Hamilton 8:30 a.m. at Sts. Peter and Paul Church, Nauvoo Noon at Immaculate Conception Church, Carthage 5 p.m. at Sacred Heart Church, Dallas City 7 p.m. at Sacred Heart Church, Warsaw

Stations of the Cross

Sacred Heart Church in Dallas City will have the Stations of the Cross every Wednesday evening after Ash Wednesday at 5:15 p.m., prior to the 5:30 p.m. Wednesday evening Mass. Besides this provision, each church will have a Friday evening Stations of the Cross at 5:15 p.m., followed by 5:30 p.m. Mass, and will host a fish fry. The dates are as follows:

February 16 at Sts. Peter and Paul Church and Alleman Council Hall. Knights of Columbus.

February 23 at Sacred Heart Church in Warsaw.

March 1 at St. Mary Church in Hamilton.

March 8 at Sts. Peter and Paul Church and Alleman Council Hall, Knights of Columbus.

March 15 at Sacred Heart Church in Dallas City.

March 22 at Immaculate Conception Church in Carthage, St. James K of C's. (Our appreciation goes out to St. James Council K of C's, who are aware of so many fish fries in the community that they didn't want to diminish attendance for other locations. Good move for Carthage, guys!)

Healing Service. Saturday, February 17, St. Mary Church, Hamilton, after the 5:30 p.m. Mass. The ministry of Mr. Roger Shaner, the Sacraments of Healing, and intercessory prayer to Bishop Fulton Sheen and Father Augustine Tolton - all, in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

What The Gospel of Mark Teaches: Just By The Way It's Put Together. There are DVD series, books, and YouTube selections galore teaching the revolutionary and daring message of the Gospel of Mark. But if you wouldn't have had a chance to read about it, or see and hear about it, would you be able to tell how bold this Gospel is, *simply by looking at how it's put together? Yes, you can!* They call it "Structural Analysis". Fr. Tony will present an outline of the first part of the Gospel of Mark. Participants will enter into the Gospel by seeing countless combinations of passages from Scripture in such a way that they "see" what the Gospel says by how it's composed. Coincidence? Prayer and Scripture for the Season of Lent At the entrances of all of our churches, we will have available Lenten editions of "The Word Among Us," and the little blue prayer book, "The Catholic Devotional." These resources will be available before Lent, and into the first two weeks of Lent.

This Lent set aside some time to spend with the Lord in Quiet. Eucharistic Adoration will be available Thursday nights from 7 to 8 p.m. in the following locations: February 15 Nauvoo and Dallas City, February 22 Warsaw and Cartage, February 29 Dallas City and Hamilton, March 7 Carthage and Nauvoo, March 14 Warsaw and Dallas City and March 21 Hamilton and Nauvoo.

Combine Your Lenten Journey with National Relief Collections. Lent is the time during which the Church conducts The Catholic Relief Services Collection, and the Aid to Central and Eastern European Churches Collection. While there are conflicting reactions to these efforts - no escaping politics! - we don't strongarm anyone, one way or another. Please read the fliers in our bulletins in future weeks and decide for yourselves whether you want to include your participation in these collections with your Lenten journey this year.
